Chinese Minor Requirement:

Twenty-four quarter hours of language course work above the elementary level (CHIN 1001-2-3) and the options are:
CHIN 2001-2-3 sequence (4 qtr hrs each) (4 qtr hrs per class)
CHIN 2100, 3101 and 3102 Composition and Conversation I, II and III (4 qtr hrs each)
CHIN 3201 Business Chinese I (4 qtr hrs)
CHIN 3300 Chinese Society in Transition (4 qtr hrs)
CHIN 3400 Chinese Society in Cinema (4 qtr hrs)
CHIN 3500 Reading in Modern Chinese Literature (4 qtr hrs)
CHIN 3700 Special Topics on Chinese Literature and Film Studies (4 qtr hrs each)

One cognate class (4 qtr hrs) taught in English that deals mainly or exclusively with Chinese civilization (philosophy, religion, literature and art), history, economics or political science, in the category of AHSS, Advanced Seminar, a pertinent department course, or a course taken in one of Cherrington Global Scholar programs in China.

Cherrington Global Scholars Program in China

The program is operated by four Chinese universities:

1) Beijing Institute of Asian Studies, located in Beijing University, China's most prestigious university;

2) the Institute for the International Education of Students (IES), located at Beijing Foreign Studies University;

3) Alliance for Global Education located at Fudan University and Shanghai University of Finance and Economics in Shanghai;

4) University of Hong Kong in Hong Kong.

Each program has its unique features and various areas of study, but all require study of the Chinese language. Check <http://www.du.edu/globalscholars> for detailed information.
