### Myhren Gallery presents annual graduate exhibition *Exhibit brings together works by BFA and MFA students for the first time*

DENVER— The University of Denver Victoria H. Myhren Gallery will showcase the works of 17 graduating students beginning May 15, 2008. An opening reception will be held Thursday, May 15 from 5 to 8 p.m.

For the first time, the “*BFA/MFA Exhibition*” will comprise works from students graduating from both the Bachelors of Fine Arts program and the Masters of Fine Arts program in studio arts, pre-conservation, and electronic media arts and design (eMAD). This annual presentation of works by students graduating from the DU School of Art and Art history is organized by Dan Jacobs, director of the Victoria H. Myhren Gallery at the University of Denver.

For this year’s show, MFA student Phillip Faulkner will create a large-scale projection on the exterior of the building, a first for an exhibition in the School of Art and Art History. Among other projects, pre-conservation students Nicole Saint and Stefani Schulte will include pieces showcasing the restoration of a 1930s Edward Thompson mural in DU’s Margery Reed Building auditorium.
