Early this morning you received two DUAlerts: the first one announced a suspicious person on campus; the second one, several minutes later, announced a forcible fondling incident at Asbury and Josephine.

Both alerts were related to the same incident.

While no suspect has been apprehended, members of the community are free to move about campus. Classes and events are continuing as scheduled.

We apologize for not sending an update sooner.

Please remember to travel in groups, especially after dark, and to request an escort by calling 303-871-2334 if you are concerned for your personal safety.
