Dr. Carol Newsom

Dr. Newsom was part of the international team that edited and translated the Dead Sea Scrolls in the 1980s, and has published a major collection of liturgical texts as well as several other Qumran texts. Other publications include a monograph on self-formation in sectarian community, and *The Book of Job: A Contest of Moral Imaginations* (Oxford University Press, 2003).

Dr. Newsom is the Charles Howard Candler Professor of Old Testament/Hebrew Bible at the Candler School of Theology and the Graduate Division of Religion at Emory University. Her current research focuses on the Dead Sea Scrolls, the Wisdom tradition, the book of Daniel, and apocalyptic literature.
