Benefits Updates

- Open Enrollment is from May 1 May 15, 2024.
- All benefited employees must participate in this active open enrollment in our new benefits administration system.
- DU is moving our benefits plan year to January 1 through December 31, starting in January 2025.
- Benefited employees will have another opportunity to enroll in October 2024, if needed.
- Employees can choose from either Cigna plans or Kaiser Permanente plans during this year's May enrollment.
- Many resources are available to help understand this year's benefit options.



2024 Open Enrollment – Important Updates



The NEW benefits enrollment system will open at midnight Wednesday, May 1 and close Wednesday, May 15 at 11:59 PM.

All benefited employees must participate in this ACTIVE open enrollment.

All elections made during this enrollment will be effective:

July 1, 2024, through December 31, 2024.

You will have another opportunity to make changes in October 2024 to your benefit plan elections effective January 2025.

Participation in the October 2024 open enrollment will be required only if making changes or electing an FSA.

Employee Self- Review	The employee self-review is your opportunity to capture your accomplishments and rate yourself on your job goals and objectives and competencies.	Due April 15
Manager Review	The manager review and employee meeting is the manager's opportunity to acknowledge the employee's accomplishments throughout the year. The manager hosts a performance review meeting with the employee, updates the final review as needed, and then signs off.	Due April 29
Employee Acknowledgement	The employee acknowledgement completes the performance review.	Due May 6

2023-2024 Merit

- Appointed faculty and staff are required to complete the performance review process to be eligible.
- For an employee to be eligible for merit, they must have a hire date prior to or on April 1, 2024.
- Eligibility does not guarantee a merit award.
- Merit increases for those individuals hired July 1, 2023, to April 1, 2024, will be prorated for months employed.
- Merit increases for both monthly and bi-weekly paid employees effective: July 1, 2024.

Denver Difference Fast Facts

- We have been in the silent phase of this campaign since 2018.
- We are publicly launching in April, 2024 with a \$1B goal as well as an engagement goal of 135k and a volunteer goal of 7,500
- There's no end date for the campaign, but we anticipate it will take 5+ years
- Typical of a public launch, we have raised more than half of our total campaign fundraising goal
- Every school and unit has set their own fundraising goals for the campaign and established priorities for fundraising




- Open to all, including staff, students, friends, family and children, elders, DU neighbors, Denver community members, and beyond – all are welcome!




