- Hoses

### Motor

- Crawl under “smoke” (sheet)
- Practice fire drill in classroom
- Learn and practice “stop, drop and roll” method
- Take a walk and count fire hydrants
- Slide down “pole” (ladder and slide)

### Floor Play

- Dollhouses and miniature people for pretend play
- Felt dress-up firefighters
- Toy trucks and fire stations
- Build with wooden blocks and miniatures
- Stop, Drop and Roll

### Art

- Paper plate smoke detectors
- Shoe box fire trucks
- Soda bottle fire extinguishers/oxygen tanks
- Construction paper firefighter hats
- Charcoal drawings
- Fire spatters (paint and straws)
- Paint with yellow, orange and red
- Sidewalk flames (chalk and squirt bottles)

- “I’m a Little Firefighter”
- “Hurry, Hurry, Drive the Fire Truck”
- “Stop, Drop and Roll”

### Props and Equipment

- Toy fire trucks and fire stations
- Firefighter clothes (hats, boots, coats, etc.)
- Hoses
- Large cardboard boxes (oven, refrigerator, bike, etc.)
- Play phones
- Maps
- Charcoal
- Red and orange jell-o
- Whipped cream (cans and tubs)
- Old smoke detectors
- 2-liter soda bottle
- Licorice (red and black)

### Special Activities

- Visit a fire station or firefighter museum
- Have a firefighter visit classroom
- Practice fire drill with firefighters and fire truck

### Grouptime

- “Brainstorm” and chart ideas
- Read various firefighter stories (story and information books)
- Discuss fire safety
- Talk about the life of a firefighter

### Sensory

- Explore with charcoal and water
- Taste “Hot Tamales” candy
- Make and taste fire truck snacks (graham crackers, circle crackers, frosting, etc.)
- Explore whipped cream smoke
- Fire Findings (items hidden in red tissue paper)
- Wash fire engines in the sensory table

### Table Play

- Class collage: fire hazards (cut out pix from mags)
- Make popsicle stick fire ladders
- Lace orange, yellow and red beads
- Explore maps
- Magnet picture board (house, fire truck, firefighter)

### Science & Math

- Learn and distinguish numbers 9-1-1
- Examine and learn about smoke detectors
- Hot and cold polymer experiments
- Fire helmet Concentration game
- Mix red and yellow paint in baggies to make orange

- Practice writing numbers 9-1-1

- Make signs for dramatic play area
