As a student at the Quinn School of Business, which boasts several international business accreditations, you will be joining the largest and most vibrant business school in Ireland. The University College Dublin dates from 1851 and has approximately 20,000 students. The attractive, suburban campus is located only three miles from central Dublin.

Location

The main campus of University College Dublin is located in the Dublin suburb of Belfield. The university has modern and extensive facilities including an indoor sports complex, a new state of the art Students' Union, and an 18-hole pitch and putt course. A short bus ride takes you into the center of Dublin. With more than one million residents, Dublin is over twice the size of Denver. It promises all that a large urban setting has to offer—art, music, culture, museums, and so on. It was even recently voted fourth as Europe's most popular city destination after London, Paris, and Rome. Dubliners' genuine social interactions, humor, relaxed attitude, music, and storytelling mixed with the city's recent cosmopolitan economic growth make the city shine as a representation of modern Ireland.

Areas of Study

You will take three to four business classes among the following Quinn School of Business departments: accounting, finance, business management, international business, industrial relations, human resource management, management information systems, and marketing. In addition to these business classes, you will be enrolled in an Irish History and Culture class with other international students. This course includes several field trips around Ireland and has historically been approved for CORE credit at DU.

Program Cost

Because this is a University of Denver Program, you will pay DU directly for your term abroad. Fees include the following:

- University of Denver tuition
- University of Denver technology fee
- **If you are not participating as a Cherrington Global Scholar, a \$50 application fee (and an additional program fee) applies**
- University of Denver study abroad housing

DU institutional aid, along with federal or state financial aid other than work-study, will apply to the DU program cost.  - Official transcript(s) from other universities attended, if applicable
 - Cherrington petition. *Speak to your study abroad advisor about the petition process if you are not eligible for Cherrington.*
 - \$50 application fee, if you are not eligible for Cherrington
- University College Dublin application including:
 - “Study Abroad Student Application 2006/2007” + photocopy
 - One passport-sized photo affixed
 - Brief essay describing your reason for going to Quinn + photocopy
 - One academic recommendation form or letter
 - One personal or professional recommendation form or letter
