Situated on New Zealand's North Island, the University of Auckland offers study abroad students both strong academics and an outstanding location for travel and exploration. The University is New Zealand's only member of *Universitas 21*, an international alliance of comprehensive research-intensive universities. More than 33,000 students make up the current population, including approximately 4,800 international students.

## Location

The Auckland region is home to 1.3 million people, approximately one-third of New Zealand's population. The city of Auckland, known as the "City of Sails" because of the number of yachts which sail in the harbors and the adjoining Hauraki Gulf, provides a dynamic and stunning setting for study abroad. With a diverse range of activities available in its three harbors, two mountain ranges, and more than 50 islands, Auckland consistently receives high ratings for its quality of life. Combining the natural beauty of New Zealand with the country's leading cultural scene, Auckland has all the qualities that make New Zealand a popular study abroad and travel destination.

## Areas of Study

Arts; business and information management; commerce; education; engineering; fine arts; health sciences; law; medicine; music; music education; performing arts; planning; property; science; technology; theology; visual arts. Subjects that may be of interest to DU students include art history, biology, business, English, geography, Maori and Pacific studies, music, real estate, and psychology.

## Program Cost

Because this is a University of Denver Program, you will pay DU directly for your term abroad. Fees include the following:

- University of Denver tuition
- University of Denver study abroad housing
- University of Denver technology fee
- **If you are not participating as a Cherrington Global Scholar, a \$50 application fee and an additional program fee**

DU institutional aid, along with federal or state financial aid other than work-study, will apply to the DU program cost. ### Application Deadlines

January 18: **Priority Deadline** for U of Auckland’s Semester 2 (July - November)

March 14: Regular Deadline for U of Auckland’s Semester 2 (July - November)

October 1: Deadline for U of Auckland’s Semester 1 (February - June) or Academic Year (February - November)

- \$50 application fee, if you are not eligible for Cherrington
- Music majors only:* Completed “Lamont School of Music – Course Approvals” Form

#### **University of Auckland application includes:**

- Written Application\* for Admission to the University of Auckland Study Abroad Programme, plus one photocopy
- Photocopy of passport photo page
- One passport-sized photograph
