

STUDY ABROAD IN MUSIC

WHY STUDY ABROAD? Your study abroad experience will provide you with new and exciting musical perspectives—through performance within an international community, course work, concert attendance and private lessons. Depending upon the country and program you may perform, study or hear music in its city or country of origin. Students may choose to study abroad at any one of many universities around the world, but not all universities have a music program that will fulfill requirements necessary for graduation. Thus, in order to graduate on time, students must carefully examine their options and plan well in advance how to meet the Lamont graduation requirements either prior to or upon their return.

HOW DO I CHOOSE A PROGRAM? When choosing a program you should focus on which experience will best benefit your academic career, and which location fits your personal interests and goals.

WHEN CAN I STUDY ABROAD? Most University of Denver students study abroad during the fall quarter of their junior year. The next most popular term of study is fall of the senior year. You may decide that it is better to study abroad during another year or quarter, but studying prior to your junior year under the Cherrington program requires a successful petition. Studying abroad as a Cherrington Global Scholar requires quarter-length or longer study on a University of Denver program. Students ineligible for Cherrington may study at some of these same DU programs but without the special Cherrington benefits. In addition, students may choose interterm or summer programs, which are not eligible for Cherrington. These most often are faculty-led DU programs, but many non-DU summer programs are available as well. Students also may choose non-DU programs within the primary academic year.

WHERE CAN I STUDY ABROAD? University of Denver students can study in more than 40 countries at more than 100 universities and programs. Course offerings include Foundations and elective opportunities in addition to music.

CHERRINGTON GLOBAL SCHOLARS

At the University of Denver we consider study abroad important preparation for life, work and success in the global community. The University believes so strongly in study abroad that it has created a unique program-Cherrington Global Scholars (CGS) - to ensure that every eligible junior and senior has the chance to participate.

Apart from the variables of personal expenses, the University seeks to make study abroad available at the cost of a term at DU. As a Cherrington Global Scholar you will pay the normal costs of DU tuition, fees and, in most cases, housing, as well as the cost of DU's Mt. Evans meal plan when board has been secured in advance by DU. In addition, the University will pay the cost of transportation from Denver to and from your study abroad site, your student visa application fee, mandatory excursions, and supplemental medical insurance if required by the host institution or country.

Please note that a student is eligible only once for study under the provisions of the Cherrington Global Scholars Program. Participation in an additional DU program will incur whatever costs are applicable to students who are not eligible for Cherrington. Students participating in non-DU programs abroad pay the costs of such programs directly and are not eligible for institutional financial aid. They are eligible for federal and state aid.

Below you will find a *sample* of Cherrington-eligible DU programs abroad that offer courses in English for Music majors. In most cases non-Music courses are available as well.
