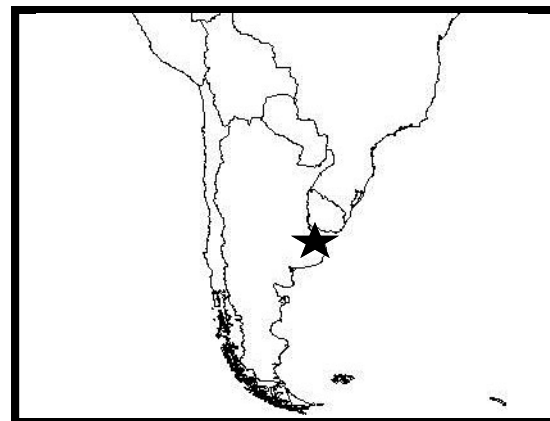

### PROGRAM

International Studies Abroad (ISA) offers beginning, intermediate, and advanced level students the opportunity to study Latin American Studies and Spanish Language at the University of Belgrano. The university was founded in 1964, and is located in the Belgrano neighborhood of Buenos Aires. Approximately 14,000 Argentine students and 1,000 international students are enrolled at the university. Your classmates will be other U.S. and international students rather than Argentine students. ISA provides an orientation, housing, excursions, and on-site support.

### ACADEMICS

Students in the Latin American Studies program will take four to five classes. Classes are offered in English and in Spanish; only students who are at a high intermediate or advanced level will take content classes in Spanish. Spanish language courses are offered at all levels, and students will take a placement test upon arrival to determine the appropriate language level. The Latin American Studies courses focus on social, political, economic, and cultural aspects of Argentina and the region. Classes are taught by U of Belgrano faculty. ### LOCATION: BUENOS AIRES, ARGENTINA

Buenos Aires (pop. 13 million) is the capital of Argentina, and is often referred to as the "Paris of the Americas" for its European influences. Buenos Aires is a cosmopolitan city offering theatre, dance, music, and museums as well as sporting events. You will use Buenos Aires' public transportation system to navigate the city.

### HOUSING & MEALS

Most students will live with a host family carefully selected by ISA's resident staff. Living with a host family is an excellent way to become immersed in Argentine culture and improve your Spanish language skills. Two meals per day are provided. ISA also offers housing in a *residencia* for an additional cost. The *residencia* includes three meals per day Monday through Friday. You may not select an independent housing option.

### CULTURAL CONNECTIONS

ISA organizes cultural activities and excursions in Buenos Aires as well as excursions to locations such as Iguazú Falls, Rosario, and El Tigre. Get to know Buenos Aires; while there are many things to do and see in the region, it's difficult to develop relationships and the city your home if you travel every weekend. Consider participating in ISA's ELAP (volunteer) program—while this is offered at an additional cost not covered by the University of Denver, you may choose to apply for an ISA scholarship which, if awarded, would help subsidize the expense.

# HOW TO APPLY

⇒ **Attend Study Abroad 101**

⇒ **Attend a Regional Advising Session**

Mandatory if you are considering a Spanish-speaking country. See website for schedule (same link as above).

If you already have one, make sure you know where it is and when it expires.

- Non-Cherrington students will be charged a \$50 application fee to their DU account.

## PROGRAM APPLICATION: DUE AFTER YOU'VE BEEN NOMINATED

Once you have been nominated for this program, you will be required to submit the following:

- Printed confirmation email from ISA (you receive this after completing your online application)

- ISA Application Supplement (3 pages; download upon completion of the online application)
