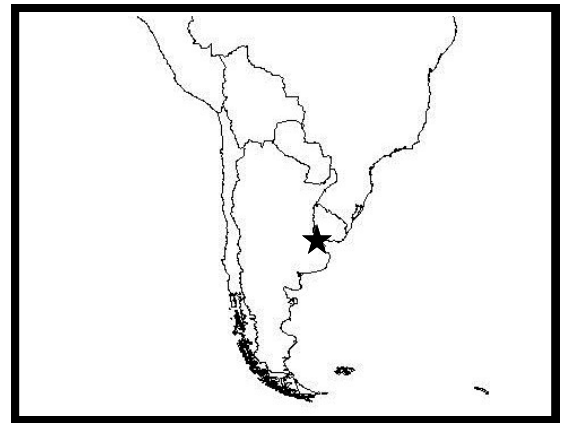

PROGRAM

The Argentine Universities Program is coordinated by the Institute for Study Abroad (IFSA)-Butler University, and offers the opportunity to cross-enroll in four universities in Buenos Aires. While students on the IFSA-Butler program come from a variety of U.S. universities, you will typically take one Spanish class with the other IFSA-Butler students and your remaining classes integrated with host country students. IFSA-Butler provides an extensive orientation, housing, excursions, and helps students navigate the Argentine university system.

ACADEMICS

All classes are taught in Spanish, and all participants will take Spanish Language and Argentine Culture. The Argentine Universities Program allows you to choose a wide range of classes from among four universities, including U Católica Argentina, U de Buenos Aires, U del Salvador, and U Torcuato di Tella. You are required to take at least 15 semester hours (22.5 quarter credits) and may bring back up to 27 quarter credits from this semester-long program. Several specialized academic concentrations are offered, including directed research; human rights; gender, diversity, and minority studies; literature; theatre; and cinema.

LOCATION: BUENOS AIRES, ARGENTINA

Buenos Aires (pop. 13 million) is the capital of Argentina, and is often referred to as the “Paris of the Americas” for its European influences. Buenos Aires is a cosmopolitan city offering many cultural and sporting events. The universities are spread throughout this large city, so commute times may vary from a few minutes to an hour. You will use Buenos Aires’ excellent public transportation system for daily transportation and to explore the city.

HOUSING & MEALS

You will live with an Argentine host family, which will provide you with additional opportunities for cultural immersion. Many students comment that interaction with the host family is one of the best ways to enhance Spanish language skills. Two meals per day are provided Sundays through Fridays, and one meal is provided on Saturdays.

CULTURAL CONNECTIONS

Take advantage of the cultural activities and volunteer opportunities arranged by IFSA-Butler—you’ll gain insight into Argentine culture as well as meet new people. Several of the academic concentrations include fieldwork opportunities with community organizations. Get to know Buenos Aires; you’ll never develop relationships and make the city your home if you spend all your time traveling. Spend time with your host family, and most importantly, speak Spanish! It is up to YOU to make the most of your study abroad experience!

⇒ **Attend Study Abroad 101**

PROGRAM APPLICATION: DUE AFTER YOU'VE BEEN NOMINATED

Once you have been nominated for this program, you will be required to submit the following:

- IFSA-Butler online application at <http://www.ifsa-butler.org/apply/apply-online.html>—submit printed confirmation email.
- IFSA Butler [supplemental forms](#) for intermediate & advanced Spanish-speaking programs, including:
 - Agreements and Releases
 - Undergraduate Program Approval
 - IFSA-Butler Recommendation form (you may submit a hard copy, or use IFSA online recommendation tool)
 - Spanish Language Report (you may submit a hard copy, or use IFSA online recommendation tool)
 - Photocopy of your passport
 - Eight (8) passport-sized photos (2x2). Please print your name on the back of each photo, and place them in a sealed envelope.

Note: The OIE will request your DU transcript; check and clear any holds now to avoid delays in processing your application!
