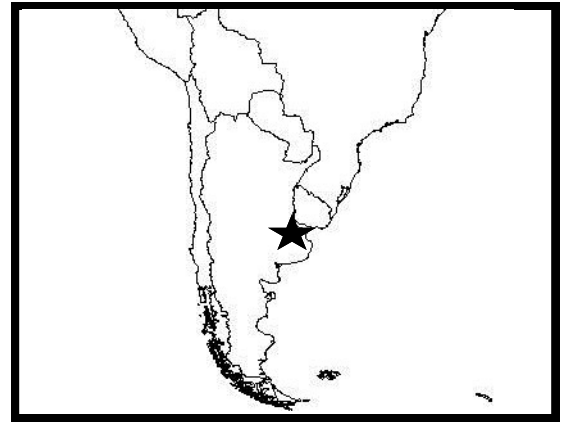

PROGRAM

IES Buenos Aires offers two programs for students: the Latin American Societies & Cultures program, open to students at all language levels, and the Advanced Spanish Immersion program for students with at least 7-8 quarters of university-level Spanish. Students on the IES program come from a variety of U.S. universities. Most courses are taught at the IES Abroad Buenos Aires Center and classmates will be U.S. students on the IES program.

ACADEMICS

Students on the Latin American Societies & Cultures program will combine Spanish language study with area studies courses in English or Spanish. Students with advanced Spanish language proficiency may be able to take select classes at IES partner universities in Buenos Aires. Students on the Advanced Spanish Immersion program will focus on language study and area studies courses in Spanish. The Immersion program also requires enrollment in at least one course at an IES partner university. Internships and a service learning course are available on both programs.

LOCATION: BUENOS AIRES, ARGENTINA

Buenos Aires (pop. 13 million, metropolitan area) is the capital of Argentina, and is often referred to as the “Paris of the Americas” for its European influences. Buenos Aires is a cosmopolitan city offering theatre, dance, music, and museums as well as sporting events.

HOUSING & MEALS

Most students will live with a señora or host family. Since most students will not take classes with Argentine students, the homestay provides an opportunity for cultural immersion. Many students find that interaction with the host family is one of the best ways to improve Spanish language skills. Ten meals per week are included. Homestays are typically within a 30-minute commute of the IES Abroad Center. A very limited number of placements are available in a residencia, which also includes ten meals per week. Independent housing is not permitted.

CULTURAL CONNECTIONS

IES organizes partially subsidized excursions to locations such as Asuncion (Paraguay), Colonia and Montevideo (Uruguay), El Tigre, and Tandil. Most day trips are included in the program cost. We encourage you to consider an internship, service learning, or volunteer options. Spend time with your host family, and most importantly, speak Spanish! It is up to YOU to make the most of your study abroad experience!

HOW TO APPLY

⇒ **Attend Study Abroad 101**

⇒ **Apply to study abroad!**

- Non-Cherrington students will be charged a \$50 application fee to their DU account.

PROGRAM APPLICATION: DUE AFTER YOU'VE BEEN NOMINATED

Once you have been nominated for this program, you will be required to submit the following:

- Online application at www.iesabroad.org —print confirmation email and submit to our office
Note: DU students do NOT need to pay the \$50 IES application fee
- IES Authorization and Evaluation Form
- Foreign Language Assessment Form (Advanced Spanish Immersion program only)
- Advanced Spanish Immersion applicants who wish to take classes at U Torcuato di Tella may have additional application requirements—see www.iesabroad.org for more details.
- Supplementary application materials for students with GPAs lower than 3.0: (1) Professor Recommendation Form; (2) Personal Essay
- Optional—IES Scholarship Application. See www.iesabroad.org for more details.
