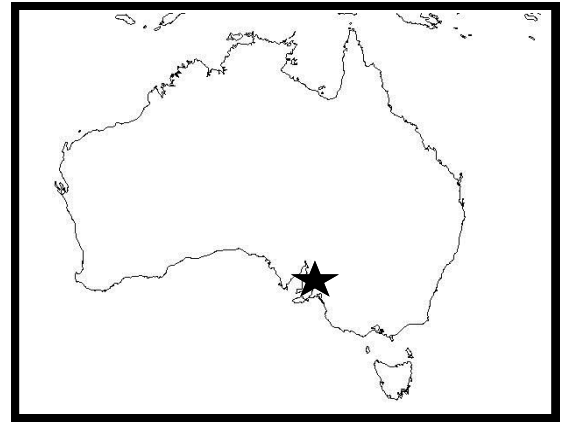

PROGRAM

Established in 1874, the University of Adelaide is the third oldest university in Australia. The University offers a dynamic and supportive environment and is internationally known for its strengths in the biological sciences, the physical sciences, information technology and telecommunications, environmental sciences, and social sciences. It is a member of the Group of Eight—Australia's leading research universities—and it is considered one of the most prestigious universities in Australia. Approximately 22,000 students currently study at the University of Adelaide.

ACADEMICS

You can take courses from many different faculties at Adelaide as long as you have the prerequisites. The University has courses in business, engineering, computer science, psychology, as well as arts and humanities. With its extensive orientation process, students will gain a quick understanding of the University with the help of peer advisors. Most courses include 2-4 hours of lecture per week. You will also participate in tutorials, which are small discussion groups. A typical course load is 3-4 classes. A wide range of internships are available. Search for classes here:

LOCATION: ADELAIDE, AUSTRALIA

Adelaide is a modern city with a population of 1.2 million that thrives on the contributions of over 150 ethnic communities. Located in the state of South Australia, the city is often referred to as Australia's cultural capital for its strong support of the arts. The city is very safe and the most affordable large city in Australia. On the doorsteps of the "outback," the city offers a cosmopolitan, Mediterranean atmosphere. South Australia is home to a number of famous vineyards and beaches. It's also rumored to have more restaurants than residents. The University of Adelaide's main campus, North Terrace, is situated on the River Torrens and surrounded by parklands. This downtown location also provides easy walking access to the city's shops, museums, and nightlife.

HOUSING & MEALS

You can choose university-owned student housing arrangements, which integrate domestic and international students or the on-campus residential college. Residential Colleges generally offer social activities and academic support for its students. Meal plans are included in the residential colleges. The off-campus flats provide more independent living environments.

CULTURAL CONNECTIONS

Through the Union and Sports Union you can participate in a variety of social, cultural, and athletic activities on campus. Within Adelaide and the surrounding area are some excellent places to visit, including beaches, theaters, museums, vineyards, mountains, opal mines, and bird and animal sanctuaries.

- Non-Cherrington students will be charged a \$50 application fee to their DU account.

Note: Cherrington status may be revoked at any time due to a change in your student conduct or academic status.

PROGRAM APPLICATION: DUE AFTER YOU'VE BEEN NOMINATED

Once you've been nominated for this program, you will be required to submit the following:

- University of Adelaide Study Abroad Program Application Form www.international.adelaide.edu.au/pdf_docs/stdyab_app.pdf.
- Copy of passport details page (valid at least 6-months after program ends).
- One passport-sized color photograph with your name written on the back.
- 250 word essay on which housing option you will apply for and why. Options include St. Mark's College or the Village Apartments.
- Syllabus details of any courses needed to meet Adelaide's course prerequisites.

Note: The OIE will request your DU transcript; check and clear any holds now to avoid delays in processing your application!
