PROGRAM

Established in 1958, Monash University has grown to become the largest Australian university, with six campuses in and around Melbourne as well as two campuses overseas. Each campus caters to certain areas of study; the two largest and most academically comprehensive campuses are Clayton with 23,000 students and Caulfield with 14,000 students. Monash University is a member of Australia's Group of Eight universities.

ACADEMICS

At Monash, you have a choice in subjects from 10 different faculties. The Faculty of Arts and Design offers digital arts to glass blowing; the Faculty of Business has several internationally recognized research centers; and the Engineering Faculty is one of the largest schools in the country. The School of Music is consistently ranked among the best music schools in Australia and leads the country in internationally recognized Ethnomusicology research. They offer Communications, International Studies, Environmental Science and Australian Studies. You can find the courses you need for your major or minor. LOCATION: MELBOURNE, AUSTRALIA

Despite the some 3.5 million residents, Melbourne has a relaxing atmosphere with the city center situated beside the Yarra River. It is the capital of the state of Victoria and the second largest city in Australia. The two main campuses in Melbourne are located outside the city center about 25 minutes by train. This gives Monash University a more laid back environment. With public transportation easy to maneuver, you will find the sights of the city within easy access. Melbourne is home to people from over 100 nations, making it an ethnically diverse city. Melbourne is considered the most European of the Australian cities.

HOUSING & MEALS

You will live in one of the five Halls of Residence on the Clayton campus or apartments on Caulfield campus. Both of the housing options offer a self-catered arrangement. Each generally offers social activities and academic support for its students.

CULTURAL CONNECTIONS

Each Monash campus has its own student union that organizes events and sponsors a wide range of sport and social clubs for you to join. Monash Sport also offers adventure activities and day trips to help you explore the city and region. With over 180 student clubs, you will be able to find a connection with others on-campus. Off campus, Melbourne gives you access to the famous Great Ocean Road, the Australian Alps, and numerous beaches and water sports.

PROGRAM APPLICATION: DUE AFTER YOU'VE BEEN NOMINATED

Once you've been nominated for this program, you will be required to submit the following:

- Monash Abroad Application Form <http://www.monash.edu/international/studyabroad/applications/application-incoming.pdf>
- One academic letter of recommendation
- 500-word statement explaining why you wish to study abroad at Monash Univ.
- Three passport-sized photographs with your name written on the back
- Copy of passport details page (valid at least 6-months after program ends)

Note: The OIE will request your DU transcript; check and clear any holds now to avoid delays in processing your application!
