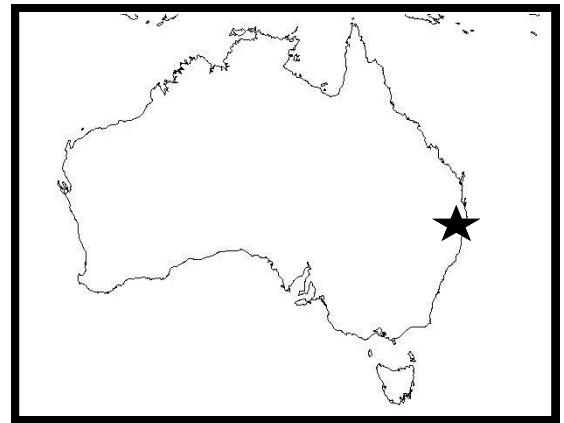

PROGRAM

Queensland University of Technology (QUT) welcomes over 6,700 international students from 90 different countries. It has won more teaching awards than any other Australian university. As a large university, it prides itself on being modern, progressive, and technologically advanced. QUT classes take a “real world” approach by balancing theory and practical experience.

ACADEMICS

Don't let its name mislead you! QUT has a wide array of courses in nearly every area of study. It is especially known for its Business School and Creative Arts faculty. However, there are 5 other faculties to choose courses from, be it communication to civil engineering or psychology. You can pick courses from four different faculties during your study abroad semester. No matter the subject, you will study alongside Aussie students and you can normally take any undergraduate courses offered by any of the University's faculties if you have the prerequisites. The Australian 3-year undergraduate degree is much more specialized, therefore 200- and 300-level courses require a strong background in the area. Most courses include 2-4 hours of lecture per week. You will also participate in tutorials, which are small discussion groups led by a teaching assistant. A typical course load is 4 classes. Search for units (courses):

LOCATION: BRISBANE, AUSTRALIA

With a population exceeding 1.8 million people, Brisbane is Australia's fastest-growing capital and offers a safe, friendly, and multicultural environment. One of QUT's two campuses—Gardens Point—is the only university campus located in the heart of Brisbane's central business district. It neighbors the Botanical Garden. The other campus, Kelvin Grove, QUT's Creative Industries Campus, is easily accessible by public transportation or the University's free shuttle service. Brisbane city is bordered by the Brisbane river and is about 45 minutes to the ocean beaches.

HOUSING & MEALS

You may choose to live in apartments at the Kelvin Grove campus or in Southbank campus apartments. The Kelvin Grove community is newly developed with students in mind. There is a free shuttle from Kelvin Grove to the Gardens Point campus. Southbank apartments offer a central location in the heart of Brisbane. Both options offer you a single room in a 3-5 bedroom furnished apartment. The options are self-catered, so you will be responsible for your own meals.

CULTURAL CONNECTIONS

The Goodwill Bridge connects the Southbank cultural district with the Garden Point campus. The Southbank is home to the Queensland Art Gallery and Queensland Museum along with numerous night spots. The city is also known for its music scene. In addition to the numerous parks, zoos, beaches, and other travel destinations in the area, QUT offers a range of activities on campus. QUT's Student Guild organizes events and manages the 70+ clubs and societies on campus for you to join. You can also participate in a variety of club sports or social—but competitive—inter-university leagues.

Once you've been nominated for this program, you will be required to submit the following:
