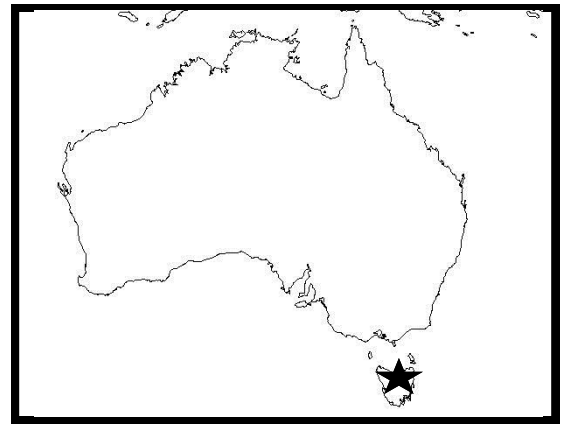

PROGRAM

Founded in Hobart in 1890, the University of Tasmania is the fourth oldest university in Australia. Today it is ranked among the top ten universities for research in Australia. With a student population of 16,000, including about 2,000 international students, the class sizes are generally small with access to the professors. Tasmania's low cost of living and unspoiled natural beauty also make this university an attractive option for study abroad.

ACADEMICS

You have plenty of courses to choose from if you pick Tasmania. Their faculties include Creative Arts, Business, Science, Humanities, and Engineering. There are subjects like Performing Arts, Management, Finance, Psychology, and Aboriginal Ed. You can take advantage of Antarctic studies or furniture design courses. There are options for most majors. You study alongside Aussie students. Most courses include 2-4 hours of lecture per week. You will also participate in tutorials, which are small discussion groups. LOCATION: HOBART AND LAUNCESTON, TASMANIA

With about 500,000 residents, Tasmania is a safe, beautiful, and clean place to live, with plenty of things to see and do. In the suburb of Sandy Bay, the Hobart campus is set on 250 acres of land, with most of its upper campus in natural bushland. The Launceston campus is two-and-a-half hours away on 125 acres at Newnham. Both campuses have easy access to the extraordinary natural beauty of Tasmania as well as the nearby city life. Just over 1/3 of the state is dedicated to World Heritage Area.

HOUSING

You can choose to live in university-owned apartments or residential colleges. All options are self-catered although there are dining halls available to all students. The apartments have single rooms with shared kitchen and bath. Christ College and John Fisher College each have a student club that promote a number of social events for their college. ACTIVITIES

Tasmania is known for its array of outdoor activities – you can hike in the mountains, surf on the coast, and walk through a rainforest all in one day. You will also have access to the arts and cultural community, such as jazz and the Wooden Boat Festival. You can also get involved with the organized events and societies arranged by the Tasmanian University Union. Through the Tasmanian University Union, you can also participate in any of the Sports Council's twenty-five unique sports clubs.
