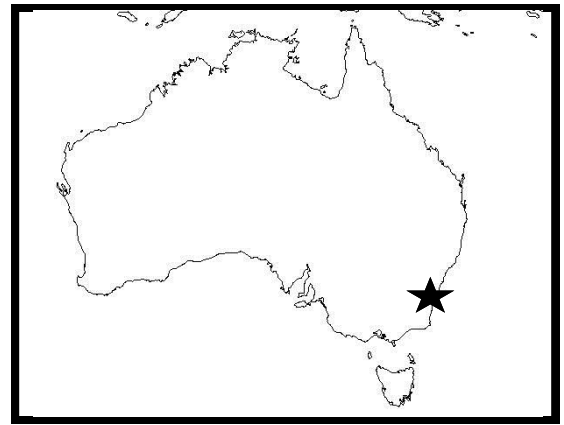

PROGRAM

Incorporated by Parliament in 1949, the University of New South Wales is one of Australia's most prestigious and competitive institutions. It is also a member of Australia's esteemed *Group of Eight* universities, whose staff conducts 70 percent of all Australian university research. Nearly 8,800 of its 40,000 students are international students, making UNSW Australia's leading international university. As a comprehensive university, students can find a variety of courses while enjoying the urban setting of UNSW.

ACADEMICS

During your study abroad term, you will have the opportunity to pick from over 450 academic programs. The Business School offers the largest range of subjects among Australian universities. In addition, you can take courses from the Engineering, Science, or Arts and Social Sciences faculties. You will have the opportunity to get pre-approved for your courses before arrival. You will study alongside Aussie students and you can normally take any undergraduate courses offered by any of the University's faculties if you have the prerequisites. Most courses include 2-4 hours of lecture per week. You will also participate in tutorials, which are small discussion groups led by a teaching assistant. A typical course load is 4 classes. The University also offers an internship option. Search for courses here:

LOCATION: SYDNEY, AUSTRALIA

Sydney is the largest and oldest city in Australia. It is a major business center, and the main Australian port of call for international airlines. Over 4 million people live in this exciting, cosmopolitan city, which offers some of the best entertainment, shopping, and sightseeing in Australia. The 85-acre main campus, Kensington, is 5 miles southeast from Sydney's central business district. It is 20 minutes by bus from the main central railway station and 30 minutes from the harbor and ferry terminals. It is also easily accessible to the many nearby seaside suburbs and within walking distance of acres of parklands and Coogee Beach.

HOUSING & MEALS

In the past, the majority of DU students have liked to live off-campus in one of the University-leased properties. These properties are located in the beach-side suburbs of Randwick, Coogee and Bondi. Randwick is within easy walking distance of UNSW, Coogee is a little further away (about a 30-minute walk or 10-minute bus ride), and Bondi is about 40 minutes by public transport to the University. You can also live on campus in student housing. The on-campus residential college generally offers a meal plan. At the apartments, you would be responsible for your own meals.

CULTURAL CONNECTIONS

UNSW at Kensington is a modern, urban campus with extensive sporting and recreational activities. There are over a hundred clubs and societies covering sporting, cultural, social, religious, hobby, and intellectual interests. Plays, concerts, films, recitals, and other cultural gatherings are frequent. The Roundhouse, the university's entertainment center, hosts many activities on a weekly basis.

Student Costs**:

- Meals, if living in an apartment

The cost of living varies in other cities and countries. Talk to returnees from the program to find out what personal expenses to expect, but remember that they vary by lifestyle. Check www.xe.com for current exchange rates.

Once you have been nominated for this program, you will be required to submit the following:

- If applying for an internship:
 - UNSW Internship Application
 - Copy of your resume
 - 500-word essay
 - Two academic letters of recommendation
- Copy of passport details page (valid at least 6-months after program ends)
