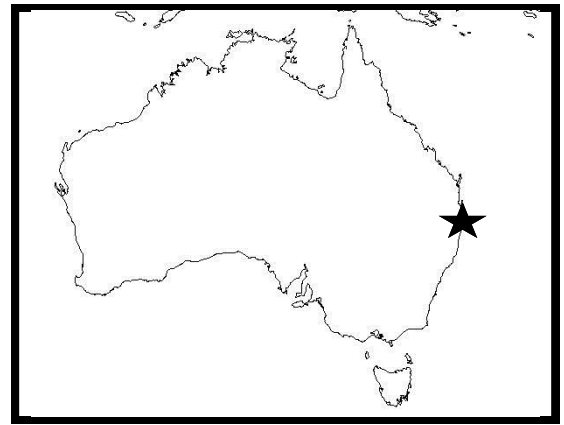

PROGRAM

You will directly enroll into the University of Queensland. Founded in 1910 as the first university in Queensland and the fifth in Australia, the University of Queensland (UQ) is a member of Australia's prestigious *Group of Eight* universities. The University is also one of only three Australian members of *Universitas 21*, an international alliance of comprehensive research-intensive universities. More than 45,000 students make up the current population, including approximately 1,000 study abroad students.

ACADEMICS

You can choose from over 4,000 courses across six faculties at UQ. The Faculty of Arts offers the widest range of courses in the Humanities than any other Australian university. If you are looking for Business courses, the Faculty of Business offer a variety of courses in Management, Finance, and Marketing. In addition, there are a number of Science courses that may appeal to you. Most courses include 2-4 hours of lecture per week. You will also participate in tutorials, which are small discussion groups led by a teaching assistant. A typical course load is 4 classes. LOCATION: BRISBANE, AUSTRALIA

Home to nearly 1.8 million people, Brisbane offers a safe, friendly, and multicultural environment. It is the capital of Queensland. Bounded by the Brisbane River on three sides, the 285-acre main university campus, St. Lucia, provides a perfect student, research, and living environment. The St. Lucia campus is fewer than ten miles from the center of Brisbane, which is widely known as Australia's most livable city and fastest-growing capital. A river taxi is available from the campus to downtown as well as bus services.

HOUSING & MEALS

You can choose to live in Residential Colleges or in off-campus housing. The Residential Colleges are a cross between dorms and a Greek house. They have group dinners and social activities so you can get to know the rest of the residents. Placement in residential colleges can be competitive. The apartments offer single rooms with shared facilities.

CULTURAL CONNECTIONS

As a student, you will be a member of the UQ Union, which provides social welfare as well as arranges events to make campus life fun. You will also be a member of UQ Sport which manages sporting facilities on campus and hosts more than 80 affiliated club sports. You can join a range of Clubs and Societies. Brisbane city offers a numerous cultural events and an active nightlife.

- Non-Cherrington students will be charged a \$50 application fee to their DU account.

PROGRAM APPLICATION: DUE AFTER YOU'VE BEEN NOMINATED

Once you have been nominated for this program, you will be required to submit the following:

- UQ Study Abroad or Student Exchange Application

- Copy of passport details page (valid at least 6-months after program ends)
- 250 word essay on which housing option you will apply for and why– if applying for a residential college make sure to write about your top 3 choices.
