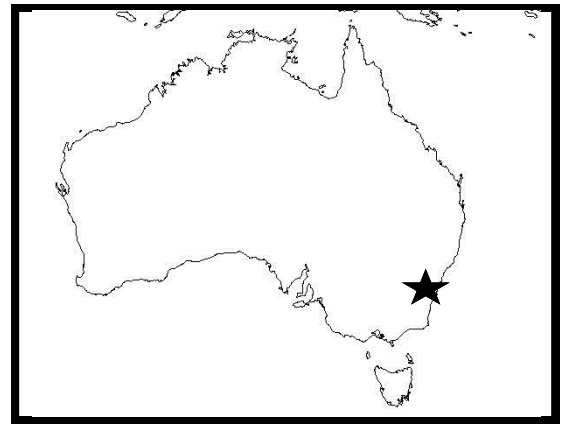

PROGRAM

Established in 1951, the University of Wollongong is the only Australian university to be twice named University of the Year by *Good Universities Guide*. Tucked against the foothills of Mt. Kiera and only minutes to the Pacific Ocean, University of Wollongong's leafy campus and strong academics have attracted a population of more than 14,000 students, including nearly 350 study abroad students.

ACADEMICS

Wollongong offers courses in nine faculties. You can take subjects like Computer Science, Civil Engineering, Chemistry or International Business. You can also take advantage of their Australian Studies program. There are no lack of opportunities within the curriculum. No matter the subject, you will study alongside Aussie students. The Australian 3-year undergraduate degree is much more specialized, therefore 200- and 300-level courses require a strong background in the area. Most courses include 2-4 hours of lecture per week. You will also participate in tutorials, which are small discussion groups led by a teaching assistant. A typical course load is 4 classes. Search for courses

LOCATION: WOLLONGONG, AUSTRALIA

With a population of over 400,000 people, Wollongong comes in as the ninth largest city in Australia. With its strong commitment to community there are numerous cultural events in the city. The University of Wollongong boasts a peaceful, landscaped campus that features streams, gardens, and bird life. Its campus is accessible to downtown by a free bus system. Wollongong's sunny weather and clean environment encourage an outdoor lifestyle that takes advantage of the surrounding national parks and beaches. Wollongong is only 90 miles from Sydney and serviced by train taking about 1 1/2 hours.

HOUSING

You will live in residence halls. There are catered and self-catered options. Each housing option offers social activities and academic support for its students. The halls offer single rooms and shared facilities to suite set-ups with single rooms and shared living area. Campus East is a five minute walk to the beach with self catered rooms.

ACTIVITIES

As the community center of the University, Wollongong's UniCentre exists to complement academic life with activities and facilities that develop the personal and social side of University life. You can shop on market days, participate in competitions, and attend first-release movie screenings. There is also a community service option. Through the Recreation and Sports Association you can swim in the Olympic-sized pool, play sports, and join in over 25 recreation clubs.
