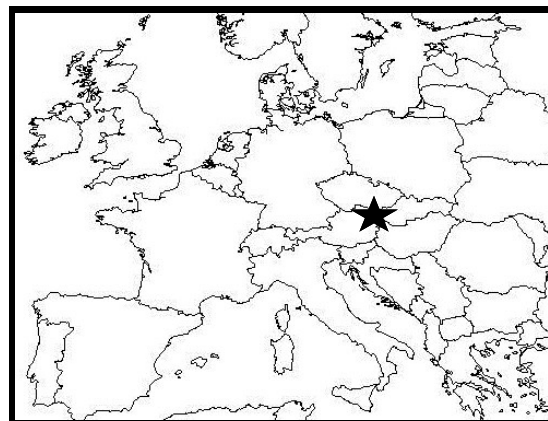

## PROGRAM

The University of Denver offers this program in cooperation with The Institute for the International Education of Students (IES). Founded in 1950, the IES Vienna study center is located in an old palace in central Vienna, and it typically enrolls 150-170 US students each semester. IES provides orientation, housing, excursions, and on-site support. The program begins with a 3-week German language intensive course (offered at all levels). At the conclusion of the language intensive, there is a week-long break in which students may take part in an optional excursion organized by IES that visits several locations in central Europe. You may also choose to create your own itinerary and travel independently during this time. Upon returning from this break, the semester begins, and the coursework commences.

## ACADEMICS

The IES Vienna Music Program is specially designed for music majors. It offers musicology coursework coupled with instrument lessons and ensemble opportunities as the *Music Performance Workshop*. Area studies courses in a variety of disciplines are also available. Previous German language experience is not required to participate. ## LOCATION: VIENNA, AUSTRIA

Located in the heart of Europe, Vienna is a city of almost 2 million inhabitants. Since its founding in the 3rd century, it has served as a bridge between a myriad of cultures. Not far from the Alps, Vienna is the capital of Austria and an EU member state that enjoys advantages as a crossroads between East and West, North and South. It hosts a wide variety of international organizations and, with its historical role in music and the arts, offers cultural opportunities that are second to none. Its concert and opera performances, art galleries, museums, and parks are just some of the reasons why Vienna was recently rated the city with the highest quality of life in the world!

## HOUSING & MEALS

The most common living arrangement is in apartments shared by four or more IES students. The apartments are located throughout the city and may involve a commute of 20-45 minutes to get to class. Meals are not included, but fully equipped kitchen facilities are provided.

## CULTURAL CONNECTIONS

The city of Vienna offers students endless cultural activities including visits to museums, plays, concerts, and the opera. IES arranges occasional cultural events and guest lectures during the program. IES Vienna also arranges an optional, subsidized weeklong trip each semester. Internships are offered for academic credit and not-for-credit, including the opportunity to teach English in an Austrian high school.

- DU short-answer essays
- Official transcript(s) from other universities attended, if applicable
- Non-Cherrington students will be charged a \$50 application fee to their DU account.

**Note:** Cherrington status may be revoked at any time due to a change in your student conduct or academic status.

## PROGRAM APPLICATION: DUE AFTER YOU'VE BEEN NOMINATED

Once you have been nominated for this program, you will be required to submit the following:

Note: DU students do NOT need to submit the \$50 Application Fee
- IES Authorization and Evaluation form
- For music students: (1) "IES Music Performance Workshop Application Form"; (2) Audition recording: see the "IES Abroad Vienna Audition Repertoire List" for specific guidelines.
- For students with GPAs lower than 3.0: (1) IES Professor Recommendation Form; (2) Personal essay explaining GPA and motivations

**Note:** The OIE will request your DU transcript; check and clear any holds now to avoid delays in processing your application!
