PROGRAM

School for International Training (SIT) programs are experiential and offer structured coursework with cultural immersion, community engagement, and independent field-based research. These are interdisciplinary, theme based programs that typically consist of 10-30 students from U.S. universities. Courses are taught by local experts, professors and professionals. SIT provides orientations, housing, educational excursions and extensive support.

ACADEMICS

SIT offers three programs in Brazil: Amazon Resource Management and Human Ecology; Public Health, Race, and Human Rights; and Social Justice and Sustainable Development. These semester programs have a set curriculum including intensive Portuguese language study, a thematic seminar, field study seminar, and an independent study project (ISP). The ISP is conducted in the final weeks of the program, and provides you with a unique opportunity to research a topic about which you are passionate in collaboration with community members and organizations. Many students consider the ISP the most rewarding and challenging aspect of the study abroad experience.

LOCATION: BELEM, FORTALEZA, OR SALVADOR, BRAZIL

The Amazon Resource Management program is based at the mouth of the Amazon River in Belem. The Public Health program is based in Salvador, the capital of the state of Bahia. The Social Justice program is located in the city of Fortaleza on Brazil's Atlantic coast.

HOUSING & MEALS

Students on each program will spend a period living with host families, both in the program base and in a rural location. Other accommodations during the programs may include small hotels, hostels, private homes, or boats. Meals are included.

CULTURAL CONNECTIONS

SIT programs provide ample opportunities for cultural engagement and immersion through homestays, connections with local experts, educational excursions and your ISP.

PREREQUISITES

The Amazon Resource Management program strongly recommends a background in environmental studies, ecology, development studies or other related field. A background in Portuguese or other Romance language is highly recommended. The Public Health program requires previous coursework in public health, development studies or other related fields. A background in Portuguese or other Romance language is highly recommended. The Social Justice program requires one semester of college-level Portuguese or one year of college-level study of another Romance language.

Student Costs:**

The cost of living varies in other cities and countries. Talk to returnees from the program to find out what personal expenses to expect, but remember that they vary by lifestyle. Check www.xe.com for current exchange rates. SIT offers scholarships; check their [website](#) for details.

PROGRAM APPLICATION: DUE AFTER YOU'VE BEEN NOMINATED

Once you have been nominated for this program, you will be required to submit the following:

- The SIT On-line Application includes essays, a letter to your homestay family, your Independent Study Project Proposal, 2 Academic References, and a Participation of Approval form.

Open the SIT application at https://secure.worldlearning.org/applications/ssa/ssa_intro.cfm.

You do NOT need to pay the application fee. Your Participation of Approval form will be completed by your OIE advisor after your application is submitted and reviewed. References should be received electronically by SIT no later than the DU application deadline. If you prefer to submit hard copies of your references they should be submitted to the OIE in a signed and sealed envelope.

Note: The OIE will request your DU transcript; check and clear any holds now to avoid delays in processing your application!
