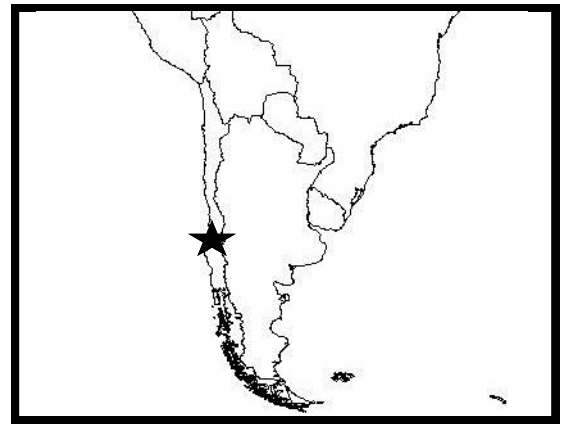

PROGRAM

International Studies Abroad (ISA) offers beginning, intermediate, and advanced level students the opportunity to study at Universidad Adolfo Ibáñez (UAI). This AACSB-accredited university was founded in 1953 and is located in Viña del Mar. For beginning, intermediate, and advanced level students, your classmates will be other U.S. and international students. Students at the high advanced level of Spanish may also take classes with Chilean students. ISA provides an orientation, housing, excursions, and on-site support.

ACADEMICS

Beginning, intermediate, and advanced level students in the Business Courses in English & Courses with Chileans program will take a Spanish course and select from among five courses taught in English focusing on marketing, economic development, political systems, and culture and identity. High advanced students (typically those who have taken 8+ quarters of Spanish) may also take courses with Chilean students in a variety of subject areas, including business, history, journalism, and literature. LOCATION: VIÑA DEL MAR, CHILE

Viña del Mar and its sister city Valparaíso (combined pop. 564,000) are located on the Pacific coast in central Chile. Viña del Mar is known as the garden city, and is a popular vacation spot for Chileans. Valparaíso is a colorful port city, and is known for its *ascensores* (funicular elevators) providing transport up and down the city's many steep hills.

HOUSING & MEALS

Most students will live with a host family carefully selected by ISA's resident staff. Living with a host family is an excellent way to become immersed in Chilean culture and improve your Spanish language skills. Three meals per day are provided. ISA also offers housing in *pensiones*, which house 4-10 students (local and international). The *pensión* option also includes three meals per day. You may not select an independent housing option.

CULTURAL CONNECTIONS

ISA organizes cultural activities and excursions in the Viña del Mar/Valparaíso area as well as a longer excursion elsewhere in Chile. Explore Chile's arts and literary traditions—and attend a fútbol game to experience the country's passion for the sport. Consider participating in ISA's ELAP (volunteer) program—while this is offered at an additional cost not covered by the University of Denver, you might apply for an ISA scholarship which, if awarded, would help subsidize the expense.

Student Costs**:

The cost of living varies in other cities and countries. Talk to returnees from the program to find out what personal expenses to expect, but remember that they vary by lifestyle. Check www.xe.com for current exchange rates.

HOW TO APPLY

⇒ **Attend Study Abroad 101**

⇒ **Attend a Regional Advising Session**

⇒ **Meet with an international education advisor.**
