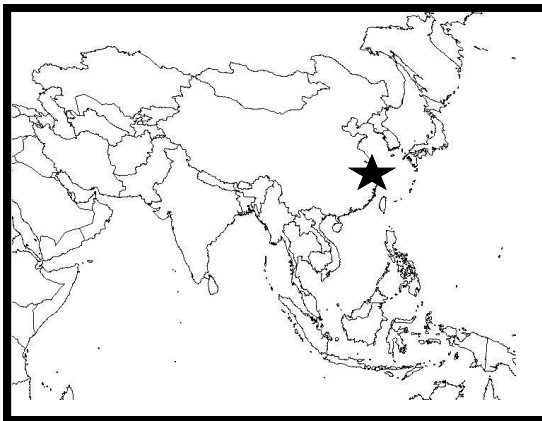

## PROGRAM

The University of Denver offers this program in cooperation with the Alliance for Global Education. This program offers two locations to study different curriculum. You can attend Fudan University with other international students to study language and culture, or you can study at Shanghai University of Finance and Economics for International Business courses (SUFEC). These courses are with other US students. Both programs require the study of Chinese. Fudan University is over 100 years old and one of the most esteemed universities in China.

## ACADEMICS

The program at Fudan University has courses in areas of study that include art history, history, international studies, literature, political science, and all levels of Mandarin Chinese. Normally students enroll in 8 semester credits of language (12 quarter hours) and choose three other courses to complete the program. The language of instruction for all the content courses is English. The Shanghai University of Finance and Economics offers all International Business courses as well as Chinese language. There is an opportunity for an internship, if you have the language background.

## LOCATION: SHANGHAI, CHINA

With a population of over 19 million, Shanghai is considered to be the business center of China. Its modern skyscrapers attest to the recent building boom and the increase of investments to the city as a whole. As with other cities in China, one can see both the modern and the old standing next to one another - the bicycle piled high with boxes parked next to the BMW sports car. Both universities are outside the city center about 15-20 minute taxi ride to the downtown area.

## HOUSING & MEALS

At Fudan University, students live in International Student Housing, which is about a ten-minute walk from campus. The housing is shared apartments. No meals are included but kitchens are available. The Shanghai University of Finance and Economics housing is with Chinese roommates on the campus. You may purchase meals at the campus cafeterias or local restaurants.

## CULTURAL CONNECTIONS

The program organizes a one-week study tour as an essential component of the classroom learning. There are also side trips which include visiting various cities around China. Shanghai offers many historical sites and cultural celebrations. Each university offers many student clubs and opportunities for sports. The recently built Shanghai Museum boasts large exhibitions which add to the cultural value of the city. Shanghai is probably most famous for its shopping. Part of the Nanjing Road has been made into a walking mall, which is the busiest shopping center anywhere in China.

### Student Costs\*\*:

- Meals

The cost of living varies in other cities and countries. Talk to returnees from the program to find out what personal expenses to expect, but remember that they vary by lifestyle. Check [www.xe.com](http://www.xe.com) for current exchange rates.

- Copy of Passport Photo Page
- Housing Preference Form (+ 1 photocopy)
- Four passport-sized photos with your name written on the back
- Course Selection Form (+ 1 photocopy)
- Optional: Internship Placement Form (+ 1 photocopy)

**Note:** The OIE will request your DU transcript; check and clear any holds now to avoid delays in processing your application!
