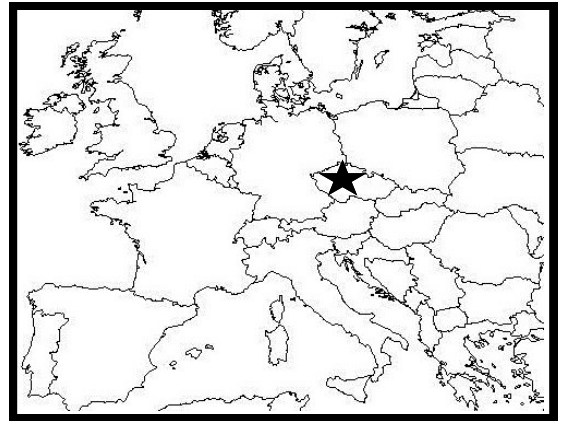

PROGRAM

Two distinct programs are offered in Prague in cooperation with International Studies Abroad (ISA). The **Liberal Arts** program is based at Charles University, and the **International Business and Economics** program is based at the University of Economics, Prague (UEP). Both of these programs are specialized for foreign students, so you will not enroll in classes with Czech students. ISA provides orientation, housing, on-site support, and excursions to participants on both programs.

ACADEMICS

Students on the **Liberal Arts (Charles University)** program will take courses focusing on art, film, economics, history, and political science in the Czech Republic and Central Europe. Students are required to enroll in an intensive Czech language program during the first few weeks of the program. Classes are with other ISA students.

The **International Business and Economics (University of Economics)** program offers coursework focusing on economics, management, finance, international relations, and marketing. Students are also required to take a Czech language course. Classes are with other ISA and international students. For a list of courses offered on each program, visit ISA's [website](#).

LOCATION: PRAGUE, CZECH REPUBLIC

Prague (pop. 1.2 million) is a UNESCO World Heritage site and a popular destination for visitors from around the globe. The city is a living museum of 1,000 years of European history. Wandering through the city streets, you'll encounter many architectural styles, from Renaissance to Art Nouveau. The city is full of famous theaters and opera houses. While students often think of Prague as a jumping off point to visit other parts of Europe, you can easily fill the entire semester exploring the city's charms.

HOUSING & MEALS

ISA organizes housing in centrally-located, furnished apartments in Prague. You will live with other students on your ISA program. The apartments come with fully-equipped kitchens; no meals are provided. You may not select independent housing.

CULTURAL CONNECTIONS

ISA organizes excursions for students on both programs. These vary by semester, but include cultural activities in Prague, day trips within the Czech Republic and a longer excursion to a nearby country. Many of the apartments where ISA students will live are in buildings with Czech families, giving you an opportunity to get to know locals. Students on the International Business and Economics program will be paired with a Czech student as part of UEP's "buddy system" program for foreign students.

COST

- DU short-answer essays
- Official transcript(s) from other universities attended, if applicable
- Non-Cherrington students will be charged a \$50 application fee to their DU account.

Notes: Cherrington status may be revoked at any time due to a change in your student conduct or academic status. Also, the OIE will request your DU transcript; check and clear any holds now to avoid delays in processing your application!

PROGRAM APPLICATION: DUE AFTER YOU'VE BEEN NOMINATED

Once you have been nominated for program, you will be required to submit the following:

- Printed confirmation email from ISA (you receive this after completing your online application)
