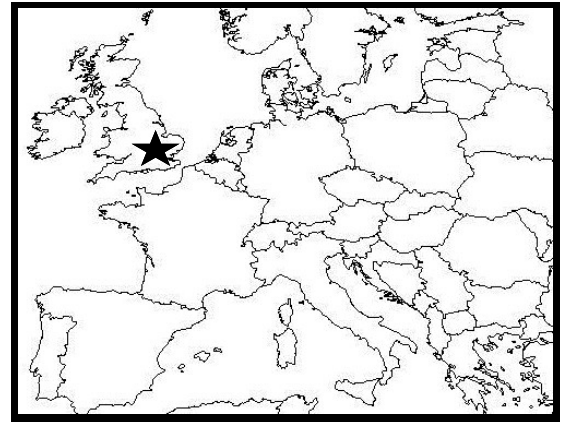

PROGRAM

Directly enroll with local students and faculty at City University London. Each year City enrolls around 150 study abroad and 1,300 new undergraduate. In total there are almost 12,000 students, making City a mid-sized British university. On-site support and a week-long orientation are provided by the Study Abroad team based in the International Office.

ACADEMICS

As the university for business and the professions, City's courses combine academic quality with a professional focus. Coursework is offered in business, computer science, engineering, economics, politics, psychology, sociology, journalism (one of the best in the UK), media studies, and music. City's Cass Business School is among the most highly regarded in the UK and holds 'triple crown' accreditation (AMBA, EQUIS and AACSB). While City's music department focuses more upon musicology than performance, private instrument lessons are arranged through the Guildhall, a leading London conservatory, and music students have the opportunity to lead an ensemble of their own design. Courses "Performing Arts in London" and "Historic London" focus on studying the city and include visits to sites of interest. Students at City take 4 course ("modules") per semester (worth 6 DU credits each). See the [website](#) for courses.

LOCATION: LONDON, ENGLAND, UK

London is the capital city of the United Kingdom with a population of nearly eight million people. City's campus is focused around Northampton Square in the centre of London. London is a great place to study, rich in history as well as the home of many cutting edge industries, artists and designers. You will never be short of things to do or visit. The central location of the University means it is within walking distance of many famous tourist attractions, including St Paul's Cathedral and the Museum of London. It is also within close range of many theatres, shopping and parks for which the City is renowned. The main campus is located in the Angel Islington area, with a vibrant coffee shop culture, local cinemas, bookshops, markets as well as many trendy bars and restaurants. There are also excellent transport links to the West End. All of City's academic and residential buildings are within a 15 minute walk of each other.

HOUSING & MEALS

Housing is with local and international students within walking-distance of campus. Bedrooms are typically private (with bathroom) with shared kitchen facilities.

CULTURAL CONNECTIONS
