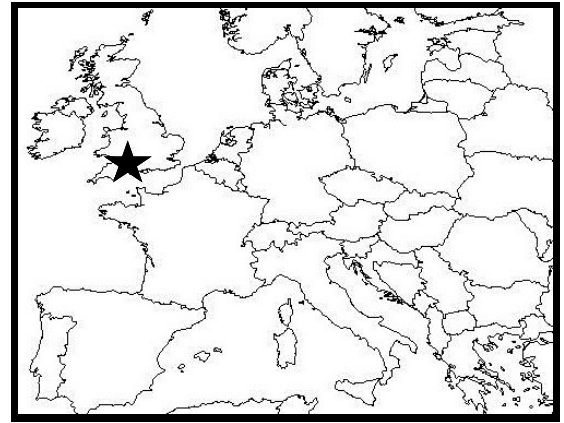

## PROGRAM

DU students are able to study at the University of Exeter with local students and professors. Most DU students who study abroad at Exeter live and study at the Streatham Campus, which has over 15,500 students and is located within walking distance of the city center. Exeter is ranked 10th in the Times Good University Guide 2012 and is one of the top 200 universities in the world according to the Times Higher Education's World University Rankings. It consistently has one of the highest National Student Survey rankings in the country. DU has an exchange with Exeter, which means that there might be Exeter students currently on campus in Denver. Ask the Study Abroad Office for their contact information so you can hear about Exeter from a local!

## ACADEMICS

You will have access to all departments on that campus (e.g., archaeology, Arab and Islamic studies, biosciences, management, classics, computer science, drama, economics, engineering, English, environmental science, film, geography, geology, history, math, physics, psychology, politics, philosophy, and theology). ## LOCATION: EXETER, ENGLAND, UK

A safe, student-friendly city within walking distance of both Streatham and St Luke's campuses, Exeter is consistently rated one of the best places to live in the UK for the quality of its facilities, low crime rate, relaxed ambience and fantastic countryside. It is a booming, vibrant mid-size city with major new developments in shopping, leisure and nightlife. It was recently rated one of the best places to live in the UK. You will study in a lovely green environment with lakes, parkland, and gardens. Exeter's campus is built around a country estate overlooking the city center. On the outskirts of the campus you can enjoy the beaches or explore the moorland and the countryside. The location close to the estuary and the sea make for great opportunities for water sports. London is a 2-hour train ride away.

## HOUSING & MEALS

Housing is typically in student self-catering apartments on campus with a private bedroom and shared (with 5-9 local or international students) kitchen bathroom facilities.

## CULTURAL CONNECTIONS

# HOW TO APPLY

⇒ **Attend Study Abroad 101**

Held weekdays at the I-House. See website for schedule ([www.du.edu/intl/abroad/info\\_sessions.html](http://www.du.edu/intl/abroad/info_sessions.html)).

⇒ **Attend a Regional Advising Session**

Mandatory if you are considering the UK or Ireland. See website for schedule (same link as above).

⇒ **Meet with an international education advisor.**

Learn about your options and get answers to your questions.

⇒ **Apply for a passport—<http://travel.state.gov/passport>**

If you already have one, make sure you know where it is and when it expires.

⇒ **Apply to study abroad!**

## DU APPLICATION: DUE FEBRUARY 8

- Academic Advisor's signature on your completed and printed online application form
- DU short-answer essays
- Official transcript(s) from other universities attended, if applicable
- Non-Cherrington students will be charged a \$50 application fee to their DU account.

**Note:** Cherrington status may be revoked at any time due to a change in your student conduct or academic status.

## PROGRAM APPLICATION: DUE AFTER YOU'VE BEEN NOMINATED

Once you've been nominated for this program, you will be required to submit the following:

- "Application Form for Study Abroad Programme" (downloadable on their [website](#)). (+1 photocopy)
- Completed Learning Agreement (module) Choice Form with course approvals from the appropriate academic advisor (+1 photocopy)
- One academic recommendation letter
- Personal Statement (+1 photocopy)

**Note:** The OIE will request your DU transcript; check and clear any holds now to avoid delays in processing your application!
