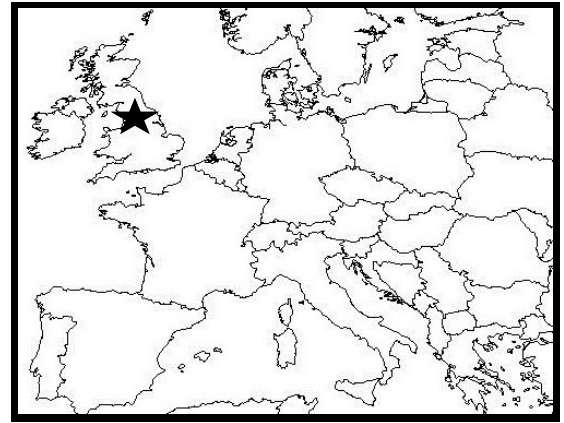

## PROGRAM

Enroll in courses with local students and faculty at Lancaster University. The program begins with a week-long orientation and social program organized by Lancaster's International Office for the some 400 students who study abroad there each year. Lancaster has about 11,000 undergraduates overall, around 2,500 of which are international students from over 100 countries. Lancaster is a solid all-around university and was ranked 10th in the UK by the Times Good University Guide in 2011. Lancaster's Management School is among the top 5 in the UK, holding triple accreditation (with AACSB).

## ACADEMICS

Students take 3-6 courses per term. Over 30 departments offer a wide array of courses (e.g., communications, creative writing, engineering, entrepreneurship, gender studies, humanities, sciences). At an additional cost, you opt for a 4-week "International Summer Program," which is a course for study abroad students about British society; it's held prior to the Michaelmas term and includes field trips.

## LOCATION: LANCASTER, ENGLAND, UK

Lancaster is a college town (population 50,000) located just four miles from the sea. The nearby Lake District, Yorkshire Dales, and Morecambe Bay in northwestern England provide abundant opportunities for outdoor pursuits, including hiking, mountaineering, sailing, rowing, and golf. If you're searching for the proper English countryside of green rolling hills, cows, and sheep, then Lancaster is the place for you. The city boasts a castle, cathedral and priory, as well as shops, theatre, cinemas, clubs, pubs and restaurants. While classes are in session, students represent a fifth of the city's population. Campus is a 15-minute bus ride from the city center and an hour long train ride from Manchester, and 2.5 hours from London, Edinburgh, and Glasgow.

## HOUSING & MEALS

Housing is typically in a single study bedroom with private shower room in a campus residence hall. Accommodation is self catering with access to a well equipped kitchen and you are housed with British and other international students.

## CULTURAL CONNECTIONS

The city of Lancaster hosts concerts, solo artists, theater events, a Literary Festival, and has live music venues. The Lancaster Students' Union (called the "LUSU") hosts over 80 social societies and over 30 sports clubs. For more, see their [website](#).

# HOW TO APPLY

⇒ **Attend Study Abroad 101**

Held weekdays at the I-House. See website for schedule ([www.du.edu/intl/abroad/info\\_sessions.html](http://www.du.edu/intl/abroad/info_sessions.html)).

⇒ **Attend a Regional Advising Session**

Mandatory if you are considering the UK or Ireland. See website for schedule (same link as above).

⇒ **Meet with an international education advisor.**

Learn about your options and get answers to your questions.

⇒ **Apply for a passport—<http://travel.state.gov/passport>**

If you already have one, make sure you know where it is and when it expires.

⇒ **Apply to study abroad!**

- Official transcript(s) from other universities attended, if applicable
- Non-Cherrington students will be charged a \$50 application fee to their DU account.

**Note:** Cherrington status may be revoked at any time due to a change in your student conduct or academic status. Also, the OIE will request your DU transcript; check and clear any holds now to avoid delays in processing your application!

## PROGRAM APPLICATION: DUE AFTER YOU'VE BEEN NOMINATED

Once you've been nominated for this program, you will be required to submit the following:

- Completed "Application for the Study Abroad Programme" Form (downloadable from their [website](#)) (+1 photocopy)
- A personal statement (+1 photocopy)
- 2 faculty recommendation letters
