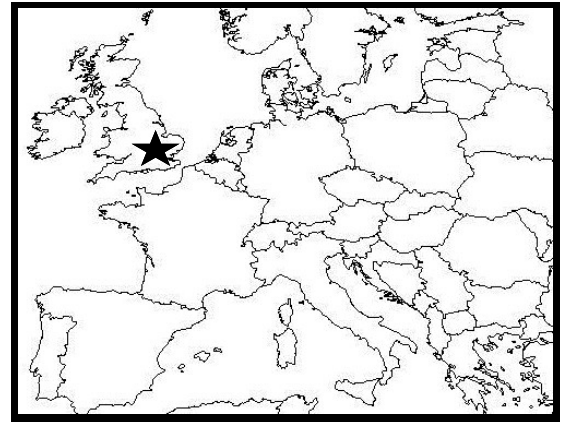

## PROGRAM

Be fully integrated by living and studying with local British students at Queen Mary, University of London. With approximately 16,000 students, Queen Mary is a major international teaching and research institution and one of the largest colleges of the University of London. Queen Mary is one of the few purpose-built university campuses in London and nearly 2,000 students living on campus. You will be one of around 20 study abroad students welcomed each semester during the week-long orientation and social program. Queen Mary International Office staff will provide continuing on-site support and activities throughout the semester for study abroad students from all over the world.

## ACADEMICS

You will have access to all departments at the University. Subjects include the following: art and architectural history, biology, business, chemistry, computer science, economics, engineering, English and drama, film and communication, geography, history, law, mathematics, languages, physics, and politics. Students typically take 4 courses per semester (each worth 6 DU credits). For current course (module) offerings, see their [website](#).

## LOCATION: LONDON, ENGLAND, UK

London is the capital city of the United Kingdom and home to nearly eight million people. The city is famed for its venerable monuments, splendid museums, royal palaces, magnificent parks, literary associations, exciting nightlife, and vibrant commerce. London is full of history and quaint corners, yet it's the trend-setting, high-tech city of the UK and a major business center that attracts people from all over the world. Queen Mary's campus is located in just east of the city centre (and less than 1 mile from the 2012 Olympic Park), free from tourists traps and the high living costs of the downtown area. Campus is situated between downtown and the financial district—a multiethnic, up-and-coming neighborhood that's an exciting environment for experiencing London's rich variety of religions, races, cultures, languages, and ideas.

## HOUSING & MEALS

Housing is in on-campus student housing complexes and typically has a single private bedroom with bathroom and kitchen facilities that are shared with 4-11 local and international students living in the same suite.

## CULTURAL CONNECTIONS

Besides exploring the city, you are encouraged to participate in the many extra-curricular activities offered by the Students' Union, which features a newly refurbished building with a subsidized fitness center and pub. # HOW TO APPLY

⇒ **Attend Study Abroad 101**

⇒ **Attend a Regional Advising Session**

Mandatory if you are considering the UK or Ireland. See website for schedule (same link as above).

⇒ **Meet with an international education advisor.**

If you already have one, make sure you know where it is and when it expires.

- Non-Cherrington students will be charged a \$50 application fee to their DU account.

**Note:** Cherrington status may be revoked at any time due to a change in your student conduct or academic status. Also, the OIE will request your DU transcript; check and clear any holds now to avoid delays in processing your application!
