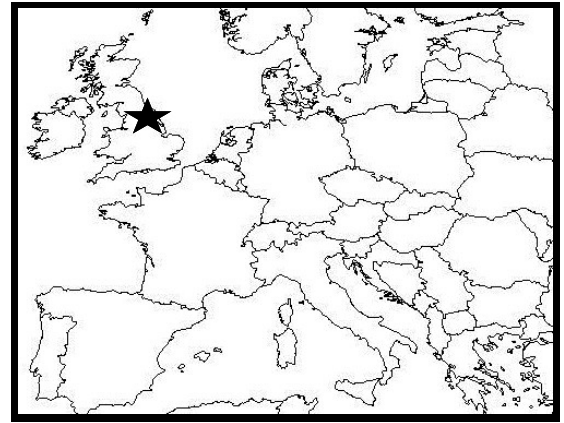

PROGRAM

Study with local British and international students at the highly regarded University of York (THE Awards University of the Year 2010). The University is growing rapidly and now has a population of approximately 13,000 students. York's Study Abroad Office provides on-site support and orientation programming.

ACADEMICS

If you plan to study for less than an academic year at York, you're allowed to take courses from a maximum of 2 departments (e.g., archaeology, art history, computer science, electronics, English, environment, health science, math, management, musicology, natural sciences, philosophy, psychology). Many of York's humanities departments (e.g., English, art history) offer classes worth 8 or 16 DU credits (a single, in-depth course could comprise your entire schedule for a term!). If you have a humanities major, please work closely with your advisors to determine if there's a way to create a suitable plan for you at York. York's more science-based departments (e.g., physics, biology) offer classes worth 4 DU credits each. The social science courses carry a variety of credit loads per module. LOCATION: YORK, ENGLAND, UK

The historic York has a population of around 130,000 and is located 2 hours by train between London and Edinburgh. York, with its medieval walls, Minster, and castle ruins, offers a number of cultural and outdoor attractions. You will feel a piece of old England as you stroll its cobble-stoned streets and markets in the heart of the city center to the famed York Minister (cathedral). York was even voted "European Tourism City of the Year" in 2007. York's campus is located a short bus ride outside of the city centre; it's focused around a lake in a pleasant parkland setting with black swans and beautifully groomed hedges. The campus is largely self-contained with shops, an athletic center, tennis and squash courts, a travel agency, a health center, theatres, and concert halls.

HOUSING & MEALS

Housing is with local and international students in colleges on campus or within a 15-minute walk. Bedrooms are typically private with shared kitchen and bathroom facilities. A catered housing option is available in some Colleges.

CULTURAL CONNECTIONS

York's Students' Union (called "YUSU") offers a variety of social and athletic clubs; for more, see their [website](#). Note that York has traditionally had a very active international student group which organizes regular events on and near campus as well as trips around England and Europe.

HOW TO APPLY

⇒ **Attend Study Abroad 101**

⇒ **Attend a Regional Advising Session**

Mandatory if you are considering the UK or Ireland. See website for schedule (same link as above).

⇒ **Meet with an international education advisor.**

⇒ **Apply for a passport—<http://travel.state.gov/passport>**

If you already have one, make sure you know where it is and when it expires.

⇒ **Apply to study abroad!**

- DU short-answer essays
- Official transcript(s) from other universities attended, if applicable
- Non-Cherrington students will be charged a \$50 application fee to their DU account.

Note: *Cherrington status may be revoked at any time due to a change in your student conduct or academic status. Also, the OIE will request your DU transcript; check and clear any holds now to avoid delays in processing your application!*

PROGRAM APPLICATION: DUE AFTER YOU'VE BEEN NOMINATED

Once you've been nominated for this program, you will be required to submit the following:

- Completed University of York Online Application for Visiting Students from their [website](#)
- One academic reference
- A list of provision modules (classes) that you plan to take at York
- 1 photocopy of the photo page of your passport
- English Majors ONLY: A Literary Critical Essay (around 1500 words) as a writing sample
