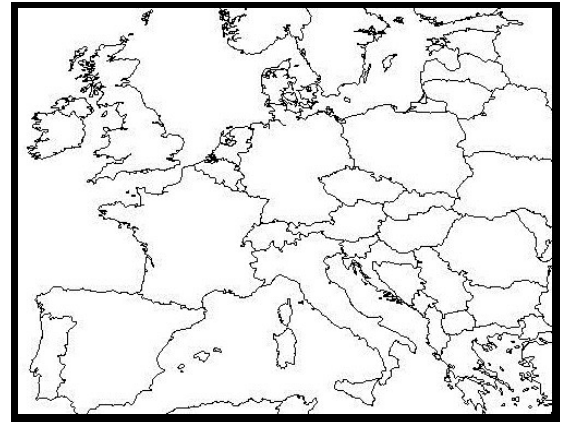

## PROGRAM

Europe has a long and rich tradition of academic, hands-on research making this program a natural study abroad option for students who are interested in a research-based career. In this program, students will have the opportunity to undertake one or two subjects at a European university and work under the direct supervision of professors and other academic staff on an ongoing academic research project chosen by both the student and faculty.

## ACADEMICS

The objectives of this program are to give students the challenge of conducting original research at the cutting edge of human knowledge and promote interactions with scholars through an immersion in the research environment. The program comprises a Language and Culture course of the host country, an in-depth literature review of the chosen research topics, and the research project. Research options can be done in a variety of fields, depending on the available places and the host university. Students have the option to choose from two options (Students will receive 25 DU credits (30 ETC) on both options):

**Option 1** is designed for students who wish to have a higher research focus. It includes a language & culture course, a methods & literature review independent study and the research project.

## ACADEMICS (CONTINUED)

**Option 2** is designed for students who wish to take an additional elective course in their field of research. Students in this option will enroll in a language & culture, a methods & literature review independent study, an elective course and their research project.

## LOCATION: EUROPE

EuroScholars partners with 12 universities across Europe; including universities in: Belgium, Finland, Germany, Italy, The Netherlands, Sweden and Switzerland. The partner universities are internationally recognized for their outstanding research in numerous fields and are ranked in the top 2% of all European universities.

## HOUSING & MEALS

Accommodation in most locations will be private rooms with shared kitchens, bathroom and/or shower facilities. The housing is, in most cases, close to the city center and either in walking distance or reachable through public transport to the campus. Meals are not included. ## CULTURAL CONNECTIONS

In addition to clubs and activities at the host institutions, EuroScholars offers a 3-day midstay program at one of the participating institutions. Students will learn about European research through lectures as well as having the chance to meet other participants conducting research in different locations.
