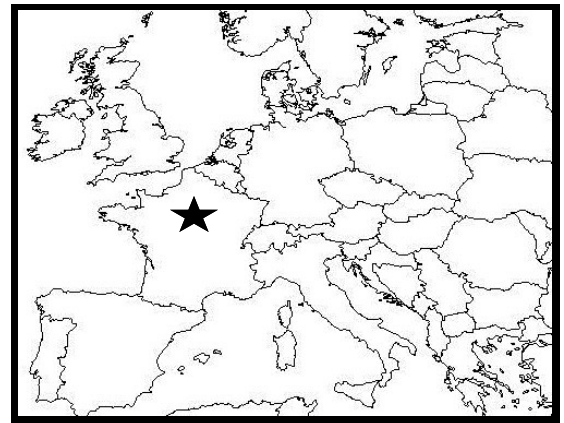

PROGRAM

International Studies Abroad (ISA) facilitates study at the Catholic University of Paris. The “Catho,” founded in 1875, is located in the heart of Paris. With 6,000 students in attendance, students are enrolled in smaller classes, enabling better ratio of student-to-teacher interactions. While the Catho is a historically Catholic University, its curriculum, campus life, and student activities are secular in nature. Students may take beginning, intermediate, and advanced level French. ISA provides additional staff support, facilities, and resources, including emergency assistance and organized travel.

ACADEMICS

The language division, or the *Institut de Langue et de Cultures Françaises* (ILCF), founded in 1948, is the primary place of study for international students. Every year the department welcomes over 2,000 students from around the world. The ILCF has upwards of 45 professors specialized in teaching French as a foreign language. Advanced-level students have the opportunity to study with local French students. Subject areas include art, architecture, history, literature, sociology, geography, theater, and communications. A limited number of courses are available in English, but the focus of your studies will be language acquisition.

LOCATION: PARIS, FRANCE

With over 11 million people, Paris is one of the most populated locations in Europe. It is also one of the world’s leading business and cultural centers. The ISA office is located in the 14th arrondissement of Paris and is a convenient 20-minute metro commute from the Catholic University of Paris and the Latin Quarter. As a student in Paris, you will become accustomed to living an urban lifestyle filled with walking, riding bikes, and taking the train or bus.

HOUSING & MEALS

Most students choose to live with host families carefully selected by ISA’s resident staff. Living with a host family is an excellent way to become immersed in French culture and improve your French language skills. Meals are provided in the home stay setting. Students may also choose to live in apartments, in which case meals are not included. **Note: DU students may not select the independent housing option.**

CULTURAL CONNECTIONS

Several excursions are included in your program cost (meals may be extra). These vary according to term and program, but may include destinations such as Chartres, Mont Saint Michel, Normandy, The Loire Valley, and Versailles. All provide ample opportunity to explore France’s wealth of architecture, culture heritage, music, and scenery. You may also meet local and international students through your classes and take part in activities at the Catho.

Student Costs**:

- Meals (if you live in an apartment)

The cost of living varies in other cities and countries. Talk to returnees from the program to find out what personal expenses to expect, but remember that they vary by lifestyle. Check www.xe.com for current exchange rates.

- Non-Cherrington students will be charged a \$50 application fee to their DU account.

Note: Cherrington status may be revoked at any time due to a change in your student conduct or academic status. Also, the OIE will request your DU transcript; check and clear any holds now to avoid delays in processing your application!

PROGRAM APPLICATION: DUE AFTER YOU'VE BEEN NOMINATED

Once you have been nominated for this program, you will be required to submit the following:

- Printed confirmation email from ISA (you receive this after completing your online application)
