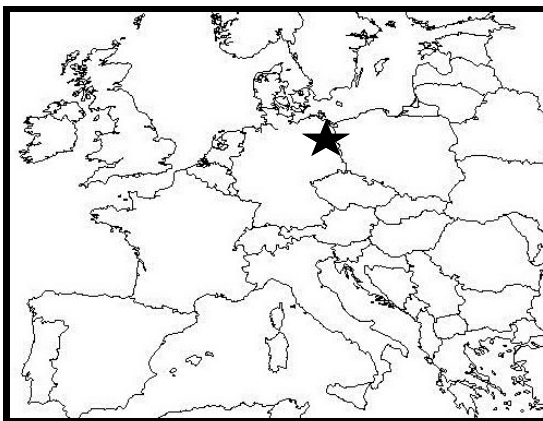

PROGRAM

DU offers this program in cooperation with The Institute for the International Education of Students (IES). The IES Berlin study center is located in the heart of the city. This particular program enrolls some 75 US students per term. The IES Berlin center provides classes taught in German by faculty from a Berliner university. The program begins with a 4-week language intensive course, pauses for a week break (in which students may opt to do an excursion organized by IES), and the regular semester begins upon return.

ACADEMICS

Besides the required language course describe above, you may choose 4 others, e.g., art history, business, film, economics, history, literature and media, politics, and the social sciences, offered at the IES center. As an extension of your studies in Berlin, you may choose to do courses with non-local or local German students at a Berlin university or an internship (see Calendar). LOCATION: BERLIN, GERMANY

A center of modern European history, Berlin has no equal for leaving its imprint on political, social, and cultural history in the 20th century. One of Europe's most vibrant cities, Berlin boasts a wide array of museums, art galleries, theaters, and cabarets. Its taste for artistic and social experimentation and effervescent night life are as alive today as they were in the 1920s. A center for business, politics, and culture, and an ideological crossroads where East meets West, Berlin is the driving force for Germany in the 21st century.

HOUSING & MEALS

Your housing will be a room or apartment that is rented by a local family or a young professional—a common living situation for local students in Berlin. No meal plan is included. This is not a home stay situation. Access to a fully equipped kitchen is provided. Note that getting from housing to the IES center will typically involve a commute using public transportation.

CULTURAL CONNECTIONS

IES Berlin organizes a major field trip to a former East bloc state each semester as well as weekend trips within Germany, depending on student interest. Cultural events and guest speakers are also features of this program. Formal internships are available (note Calendar). Volunteer opportunities are available.

Note: Cherrington status may be revoked at any time due to a change in your student conduct or academic status. Also, the OIE will request your DU transcript; check and clear any holds now to avoid delays in processing your application!

PROGRAM APPLICATION: DUE AFTER YOU'VE BEEN NOMINATED

Once you have been nominated for this program, you will be required to submit the following:

- Online application at www.iesabroad.org —print confirmation email
Note: DU students do NOT need to pay the \$50 IES application fee
- IES Authorization and Evaluation Form (hard copy)
- Supplementary application materials for students with GPAs lower than 3.0: (1) Professor Recommendation Form; (2) Personal Essay (+ 1 photocopy)
- The Foreign Language Assessment Form
- Optional— IES Scholarship Application (need- and merit-based scholarships available)
