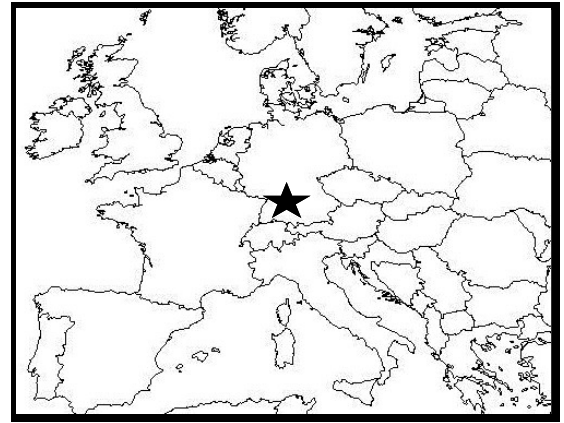

PROGRAM

Enroll directly in courses with international and local German students at the Universitaet Tuebingen, a leading research institution and one of the oldest in the country (its origins date back to 1477). Current enrollment is around 24,000, including 2,500 international students. On-site support services and an orientation are provided by its International Office. The program is integrated largely with non-native German speakers from all over Europe and the world.

ACADEMICS

The program will begin with a 3-week language and orientation course offered by the German as a Foreign Language (DaF) Department. Upon completion of the intensive, a large variety of classes are offered at the DaF during the semester (e.g., grammar, vocabulary, creative writing, history, geography, literature, and theater); these are listed on their [website](#). DaF instructors teach using an “easy-German” that is designed for non-native speakers to understand. Students are limited to 3 DaF courses per semester. Students may also enroll in courses at the greater university with local students. While most classes are taught in German, there are a growing number of courses taught in English to local students that are open to international students.

LOCATION: TUEBINGEN, GERMANY

The crooked little streets of the guilds, the numerous half-timbered houses, stores, wine cellars and student pubs make Tuebingen a beautiful location for study abroad. Located in the southwest corner of Germany, Tuebingen has a population of around 80,000 with a student population of 24,000. The large proportion of students makes it an unintimidating, “youthful city with a past.”

HOUSING & MEALS

Housing is provided in student complexes and typically offer single bedrooms with bathroom and fully-equipped kitchen facilities shared with local and international students.

CULTURAL CONNECTIONS

The DaF organizes numerous extracurricular activities, including a choir and a theatre group for non-native speakers. There is a tandem partner language program that would match you with a local student so that you could practice your language skills with each other. The Studentenwerk (student services) offers a wide variety of social, academic, and athletic groups. StudIt is the student initiative of former exchange students. Partially funded by the University’s international office, they have weekly “office hours” and host a variety of activities ([website](#)). Most student housing complexes also offer regular social activities.
