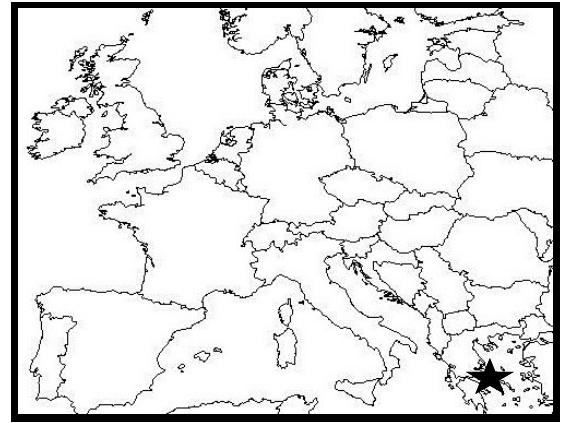

## PROGRAM

The College of Global Studies at Arcadia University operates its own center in Athens, Greece. A full-time Director and small support staff manage a group of around 60-70 American students each semester. In addition to arranging classes and housing, the Center organizes excursions and cultural activities to facilitate immersion in the local culture. The week-long orientation program includes a tour of Athens and hands-on experience learning how to navigate its winding streets and complex public transportation, as well as intensive language study.

## ACADEMICS

You are required to take a course in Modern Greek language (offered at all levels) as well as a Greek culture class called The Greek Key. The Keys class includes many practical assignments that will get you out of the classroom and engaged in the surrounding urban landscape. The class includes community-based learning, volunteering, or directed field study. All other classes are taught in English. Subjects include: Ancient Greek, Latin, history, archaeology, literature, philosophy, religion, politics, art history, economic history, and nature conservation. Students typically take 5 classes; credits awarded through Arcadia transfer to DU at a rate of 1.5.

## LOCATION: ATHENS, GREECE

With a population of just over 3 million people, Athens is the capital of Greece and one of the world's oldest cities. While Athens is a large metropolis, there is a somewhat slower pace to Athenian life than in most western countries. Located in a residential neighborhood in central Athens, the Arcadia Center offers a wonderful opportunity to immerse yourself in the Greek way of life. The Center is in close proximity to the National Library, the American School of Classical Studies, and the British School of Archaeology.

## HOUSING & MEALS

You will live in shared apartments with 4-5 other students in the neighborhood of Pangrati, which is outside the tourist area of Athens. You are not isolated in a dorm with only other college students around you—instead, your neighbors are Greek families. You'll be within a 5- to 20-minute walk from the Arcadia Center. Each apartment is fully furnished, including kitchen cookware and cutlery. As there is no meal plan, you will cook most of your meals at home.

## CULTURAL CONNECTIONS

Many courses incorporate field-study trips to sites in Athens and the surrounding area. The Greek language class incorporates a service learning component in a variety of placements, and the Student Services Council arranges many events that you can participate in throughout the semester.
