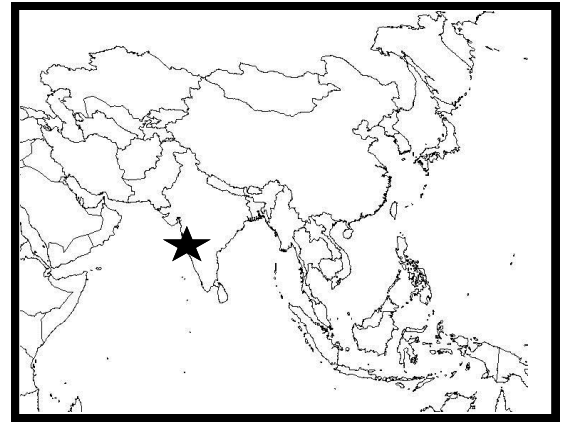

PROGRAM

This program is offered in conjunction with the Alliance for Global Education. It is based on the beautiful green campus of Fergusson College, which founded in 1885, is one of India's oldest liberal arts colleges. The program introduces students to development, environment, social justice, economics, and public health issues, within the context of India today. While based on an Indian campus, coursework is specific to the Alliance program and you will be in the classroom with Alliance students.

ACADEMICS

All students on the program are required to take a Contemporary India course and either an Internship, Directed Research, or Documentary Film course. Students receive training in field research techniques, issues and complexities specific to India, while engaging in approximately 20 hours of field experience per week. Students also select an additional 2-3 courses from a list of elective options. Internship placements include NGOs, multi-national businesses, IT companies, cultural organizations, research institutes and think tanks. Alternatively, students who choose to pursue directed field research or to create a documentary will work closely with an Alliance faculty member on their research or film.

LOCATION: PUNE, INDIA

Pune (also known as Poona) is a vibrant city of some 3.5 million people. It has long been recognized as the academic center of India. Forbes has named it one of the world's top three emerging cities. Pune is home to many of India's most prestigious academic institutions and has an active student scene. India is the world's largest democracy with a rich 3,000 year history. It is a rising economic superpower, a leader in technology, and has a booming film and media industry. The diversity of cultures within India makes you feel as if you are going to another country as you travel from east to west or north to south.

HOUSING & MEALS

To increase your level of immersion in the local community, all housing options in Pune are associated with an Indian host. Students may choose between staying with an Indian host family or living in student apartments with an Indian roommate. Both housing options include breakfast and dinner; lunch is on your own.

CULTURAL CONNECTIONS

Alliance sponsors field visits during the semester to Mumbai and rural villages and there are many opportunities for exploring local points of interest in and around Pune. Cultural courses on yoga, dance, and music are also available. There is so much to see throughout India that a semester would still not give you enough time to experience all of the diverse cultures, food and languages that this incredible country has to offer.
