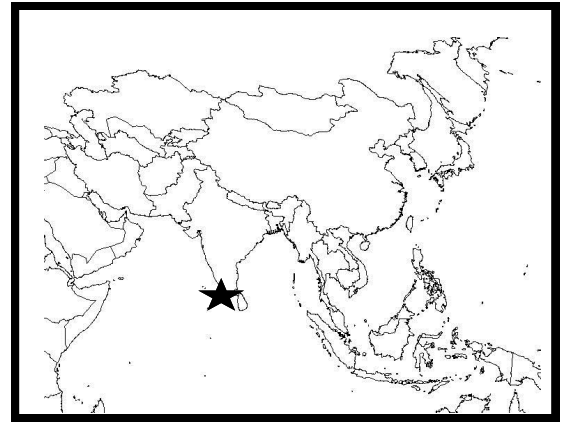

## PROGRAM

Gain hands-on experience by participating in a community internship, while learning about international development and taking Hindi language courses. This highly experiential program is a good fit for students who are interested in gaining a deeper understanding of Indian culture and development issues through field experience.

## ACADEMICS

The semester program consists of four courses: Hindi, International Development: Critical Perspectives on Theory and Practice; MSID Country Analysis; and Community Engagement in the Global South through which students engage in an internship or research project. All classes are with program participants and are taught by local faculty. Students have the opportunity to discuss the complex nature of development as realized in India.

## LOCATION: JAIPUR, INDIA

The program is based in the city of Jaipur (1.5 million), the capital of the north Indian fabled state of Rajasthan. Students may live elsewhere in the country during the internship/ research phase of the program.

## HOUSING & MEALS

Homestays are an integral part of the MSID experience. You will live with and share most meals with at least one family and possibly with two different families— one during the classroom phase and a second in a different part of the country during the remainder of the program. Students with internships in the main city typically choose to remain with the same family throughout.

## CULTURAL CONNECTIONS

Throughout the classroom portion of the program, students will visit a variety of sites that may include local markets, non-governmental organizations, farms, factories, and potential internship sites.
