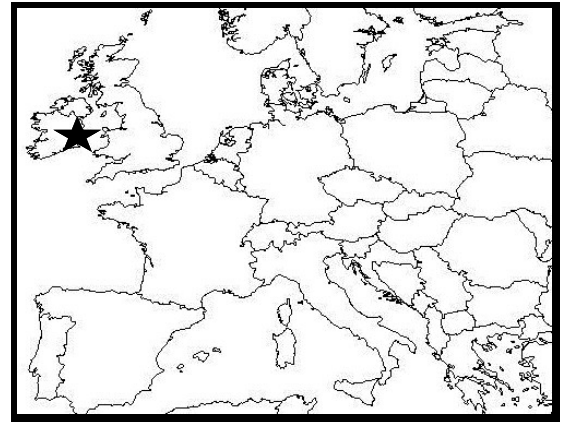

PROGRAM

Be fully integrated with local Irish and international students at the University College Dublin (UCD). UCD's origins date back to 1851, and it now enrolls approximately 24,000 students. Each college at UCD has its own study abroad office that provides on-site support, an orientation, and social programs.

ACADEMICS

7 colleges accommodate study abroad students: Arts and Celtic Studies; Human Sciences; Business & Law; Health Sciences; Agriculture, Food & Veterinary Medicine; Science; Engineering & Architecture. Students in non-arts colleges take an Irish history & culture course that includes excursions to important sites; arts students have access to the Celtic Studies coursework. Students who study at UCD focus on their majors. Each college has unique policies on the minimum number of courses that must be taken in one's major. Most colleges allow for 1-2 courses to be taken in another college. UCD's Quinn School of Business is highly regarded internationally, tops the rankings in Ireland and is the country's only Business School with American Accreditation. Science students take note of the wide variety of modules offered and research underway. See their [website](#) for course listings. Students take 5-6 classes at UCD, typically worth 4 DU credits each.

LOCATION: DUBLIN, IRELAND

Dublin was recently voted fourth as Europe's most popular city destination after London, Paris, and Rome. Dubliners' genuine social interactions, humor, relaxed attitude, music, and storytelling mixed with the city's recent cosmopolitan economic growth make the city shine as a representation of modern Ireland. The attractive and modern campus is located three miles from the city center in an upscale suburb called Belfield. It has modern and extensive facilities including an indoor sports complex, a new state of the art Students' Union, and an 18-hole pitch and putt course. A brief bus ride takes you into the center of Dublin where you can experience all that this burgeoning European city has to offer including art, music, culture, and museums.

HOUSING & MEALS

Accommodation is in a UCD residence hall, which typically offer private bedrooms with bathroom and fully equipped kitchen facilities shared with local and international students. UCD has over 30,000 rooms available so there is no shortage. UCD can also facilitate off campus housing with other DU and US study abroad students in spacious furnished apartments in the city centre along convenient bus routes to campus will be offered.

CULTURAL CONNECTIONS

UCD offers a lively campus community and a busy extracurricular life. The free cultural/social program offers excursions and field trips in Dublin and across the island. There is a huge range of social societies and athletic clubs; for more, see their [website](#).

⇒ **Attend Study Abroad 101**

⇒ **Attend a Regional Advising Session**

Mandatory if you are considering Ireland or the UK. See website for schedule (same link as above).

⇒ **Meet with an international education advisor.**

⇒ **Apply to study abroad!**
