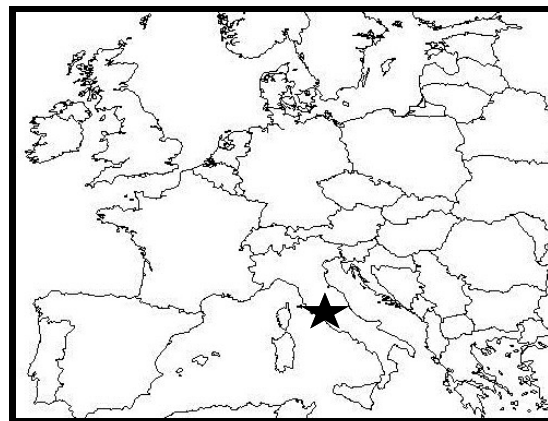

PROGRAM

International Studies Abroad (ISA) facilitates study at the American University of Rome (AUR), a private, liberal arts university that grants American degrees. The student population of between 500-600 comes from over 40 different countries. ISA provides additional facilities and support to what you will find at AUR, including a full-time Director, emergency services, an orientation program, housing accommodations, and excursions.

ACADEMICS

Your classmates at AUR will be other Americans and international students. You can choose from a variety of courses taught in English, including art history, studio arts, anthropology, business, communications, economics, finance, history, Italian, management, marketing, philosophy, and political science. A full course load consists of four to five classes per semester. Students are required to take an Italian language class. You are responsible for additional fees that may apply to different courses. Credits from AUR transfer back to DU at a rate of 1.5.

LOCATION: ROME, ITALY

As one of the founding cities of Western Civilization, Rome (*population 3.5 million*) is a striking mixture of ancient and modern. AUR is located in a beautiful villa located on Rome's highest hill, the Gianicolo, on the right bank of the Tiber River. As a student in Rome, you will become accustomed to busy traffic, long commutes, and public transportation.

HOUSING & MEALS

Students live in apartments in residential neighborhoods located on the west side of Rome, just south of Vatican City. Apartments are fully furnished, including basic kitchen cookware and utensils, and you will share a room with another AUR student. Typically, there are 2-3 bedrooms per unit. Your commute to AUR will vary, but you can expect it to take anywhere from 15-40 minutes. ISA charges a housing deposit of \$750 that you pay directly and are refunded at the end of the program if there are no damages. **Note: DU students may not select the independent housing option.**

CULTURAL CONNECTIONS

ISA organizes excursions and you can find details on their website. In addition, AUR hosts a variety of cultural, academic, travel, sporting, and social events. Get to know Rome! While there are many things to see in the region, you'll never develop relationships and make the city your home if you spend all your time traveling.

HOW TO APPLY

⇒ **Attend Study Abroad 101**

- Non-Cherrington students will be charged a \$50 application fee to their DU account.

Note: *Cherrington status may be revoked at any time due to a change in your student conduct or academic status. Also, the OIE will request your DU transcript; check and clear any holds now to avoid delays in processing your application!*

PROGRAM APPLICATION: DUE AFTER YOU'VE BEEN NOMINATED

Once you have been nominated for this program, you will be required to submit the following:

- Printed confirmation email from ISA (you receive this after completing your online application)

- ISA Application Supplement (3 pages; download upon completion of the online application)
