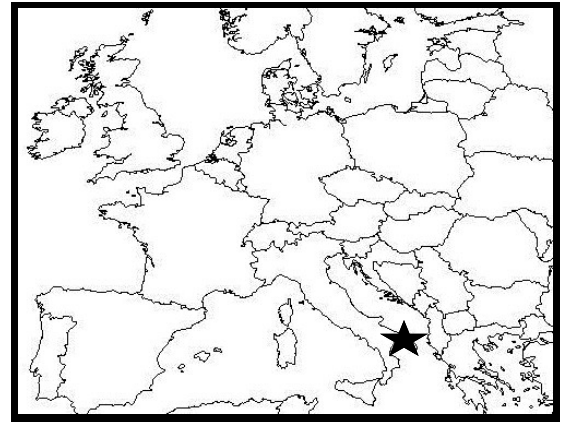

PROGRAM

The Università del Salento's modern campus was built in 1955 and enrolls over 27,000 students. As an Arcadia student, you will take most of your classes at the Language Center with other international students. In addition to facilitating your enrollment at the University and arranging your housing, Arcadia also provides on-site orientation and excursions throughout the semester. This program is ideal for students who desire a full immersion program in Italian with minimal exposure to English.

ACADEMICS

Students at all levels of Italian are fully immersed in language studies. Beginning-level students take classes with other international students at the University's Language Center and choose one course taught in English to round out their studies. Subjects vary but include literature, cinema, art history, and mafia studies. Mornings are spent in class and afternoons are spent on an array of activities, each focused on the traditional art forms and crafts of the region. Advanced students can enroll in regular University classes with Italian students, which opens up a wide variety of course topics. The Università del Salento is best known for classical and literary studies as well as the sciences, economics and engineering.

LOCATION: LECCE, ITALY

Located on the Salentine Peninsula (otherwise known as the "heel" of the "boot"), Lecce is a historic city with close to 100,000 residents. An abundance of soft, malleable limestone native to Lecce is part of the reason why baroque architecture flourished there, and why it earned the nickname the "Florence of the South." Because of its proximity to the Mediterranean and Adriatic Seas, Lecce was once part of the Greek Empire. That influence still remains in a region where Greek dialects are still spoken and Hellenic dishes are served at festivals and holidays. Modern-day Lecce is a bustling city full of students.

HOUSING & MEALS

Students may choose to share an apartment with other Arcadia students, or with international or Italian students by request. Apartments are located throughout the city and are fully furnished and equipped, including kitchen utensils and cookware. You may cook your own meals or purchase food at any number of cafeterias or restaurants and cafes around Syracuse. You may also choose to live with an Italian host family.

CULTURAL CONNECTIONS

Cultural activities are included as part of the language program, including stone carving, Italian cooking, folk music and traditional dance. Outside of class, students are encouraged to participate in any of the University activities. Arcadia arranges excursions throughout the semester to explore other parts of Italy.

Student Costs**:

- Meals, if you live in an apartment

The cost of living varies in other cities and countries. Talk to returnees from the program to find out what personal expenses to expect, but remember that they vary by lifestyle. Check www.xe.com for current exchange rates.

Note: *Cherrington status may be revoked at any time due to a change in your student conduct or academic status. Also, the OIE will request your DU transcript; check and clear any holds now to avoid delays in processing your application!*
