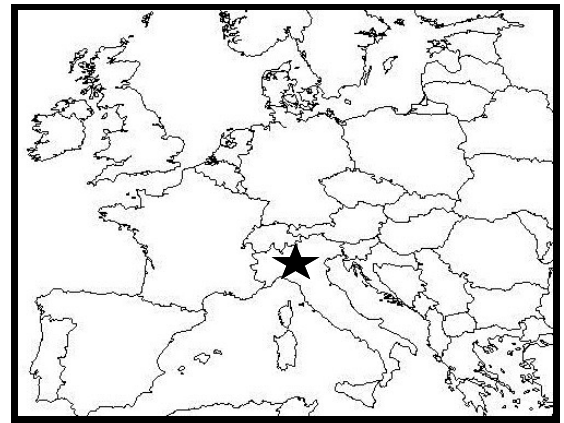

PROGRAM

IES Milan offers three programs for students: arts, humanities, social sciences, and business courses taught in English; an advanced Italian program; and a music program. Eligible students are encouraged to combine their IES coursework with one course at a local university. Qualified music students have the opportunity to receive musical instruction from one of the outstanding musical institutions in Milan, in addition to taking the music theory course and music performance workshop offered at the IES center.

ACADEMICS

IES Milan offers a variety of courses taught in English, art, business, cinema, communications, history, literature, music, political science, and sociology. Students are required to take an Italian language class. Students may also choose from a selection of courses taught in English at The Catholic University. If interested in participating in the advanced Italian language program at IES or taking classes in Italian at one of the local universities, you must have the equivalent of 2 years of university-level Italian. (Note: DU will pay for one course at one of the local universities. If you choose to take additional courses, you will be responsible for the credits.) IES also offers internships in a variety of disciplines.

LOCATION: MILAN, ITALY

With a metro population of over 7 million, Milan is the commercial, fashion, and financial center of contemporary Italy. Milan is a modern city—less touristy than Rome—and yet this is where Leonardo da Vinci painted “The Last Supper” and where Verdi and Puccini composed music that is still heard at *La Scala*. Milan’s central location allows easy access to all major Italian as well as European cities. The IES office is located in downtown Milan with access to multiple modes of public transportation.

HOUSING & MEALS

You will share a furnished apartment with up to 5 other IES students. You may request an Italian roommate, most likely a student or young professional, but IES cannot guarantee you will get one. Meals are not included, so most students make their own breakfast and dinner and eat lunch at the Università Cattolica’s inexpensive cafeteria. (*Note: If you select the Collegio di Milano housing option, you will be responsible for the additional fee.*)

CULTURAL CONNECTIONS

IES organizes optional field trips as an integral part of the program. Throughout the semester, cultural events and guest lectures are also arranged for the students. Some highlights of past years include poetry readings, ballet, opera, and musical performances at La Scala Opera House.

HOW TO APPLY

⇒ **Attend Study Abroad 101**

- DU short-answer essays
- Official transcript(s) from other universities attended, if applicable
- Non-Cherrington students will be charged a \$50 application fee to their DU account.

Note: *Cherrington status may be revoked at any time due to a change in your student conduct or academic status. Also, the OIE will request your DU transcript; check and clear any holds now to avoid delays in processing your application!*

PROGRAM APPLICATION: DUE AFTER YOU'VE BEEN NOMINATED

Once you have been nominated for this program, you will be required to submit the following:

- Online application at www.iesabroad.org —print confirmation email
- IES Authorization and Evaluation Form (hard copy)
- Supplementary application materials for students with GPAs lower than 3.0: (1) Professor Recommendation Form; (2) Personal Essay
- Optional— IES Scholarship Application (need- and merit-based scholarships available)
- DU students do NOT need to pay the \$50 IES application fee*

Warning: You must secure a student visa in order to study in Italy, a time-consuming process that may require additional travel and expense. Obtaining a visa is solely your responsibility.
