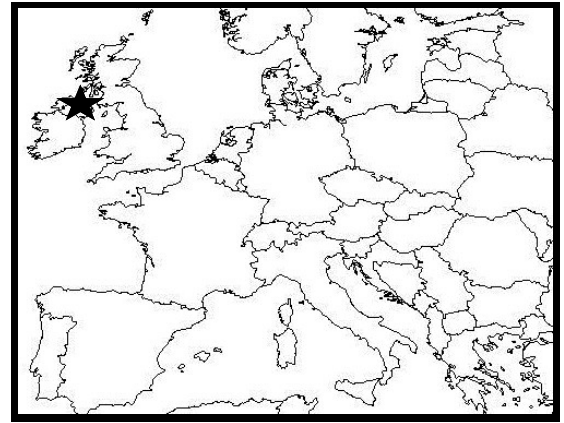

PROGRAM

Live and study with local Northern Irish and international students at one of the 4 University of Ulster campuses. There are some 27,600 students among its four campuses—Belfast, Coleraine, Londonderry, and Newtownabbey—each of which carry the national reputation for quality, diversity, and vocational strength. On-site support and a brief orientation are provided by the international office or study abroad liaison at the respective Ulster campus.

ACADEMICS

Each campus has unique academic strengths and courses, such as the following—**Belfast:** creative writing, fine arts, communications, hospitality; **Coleraine:** biology, computing, English, environmental studies, food sciences, geography, marine science, media, philosophy, psychology; **Magee:** drama, marketing, peace and conflict resolution studies (sponsored by the EU), politics, sociology; **Jordanstown:** business, communications, development, computing, engineering, human resource management, multimedia design, exercise and leisure. See their [website](#) for module listings (classes). Students take 3 modules (worth 8 DU credits each) per term. Certificates in Irish studies are available for the completion of certain sets of courses.

LOCATION: BELFAST, COLERAINE, LONDON-DERRY, OR NEWTOWNABBEY

Northern Ireland is an excellent, non-traditional location to study abroad. Besides being one of few Americans to study abroad in Northern Ireland, there are many reasons to study or visit there. It's a land scattered with story-book castles among a rural, visitor-friendly population with a fascinating recent history. Northern Ireland has great natural beauty, too. Opportunities for hiking, cycling, golfing, and water sports abound. Political turmoil has cooled and crime is now far less prevalent than in the rest of the UK. The capital *Belfast* is a thriving, cosmopolitan city of over 500,000. The *Jordanstown* campus is in *Newtownabbey*, a suburb of Belfast. *Coleraine* is home to nearly 5,000 students and is located among resort villages not far from the famous Giant's Causeway. Coleraine has the largest campus with more than 9,000 students. The Magee Campus is in *Londonderry*, a city of over 100,000 and one of the oldest cities in Ireland.

HOUSING & MEALS

You will typically live in a university residence hall in a single bedroom with kitchen and bathroom facilities shared with local and international students.

⇒ **Attend Study Abroad 101**

PROGRAM APPLICATION: DUE AFTER YOU'VE BEEN NOMINATED

Once you've been nominated for this program, you will be required to submit the following:

- Completed "Study Abroad Application" form (+ 1 photocopy). Downloadable from the [website](#).
- 1 academic recommendation letter
- Art and Design students only:
 - A portfolio in slide form with attached descriptions
 - A brief statement discussing the practice and ideas behind the work in your portfolio as well as what you hope to achieve during your studies at Ulster
