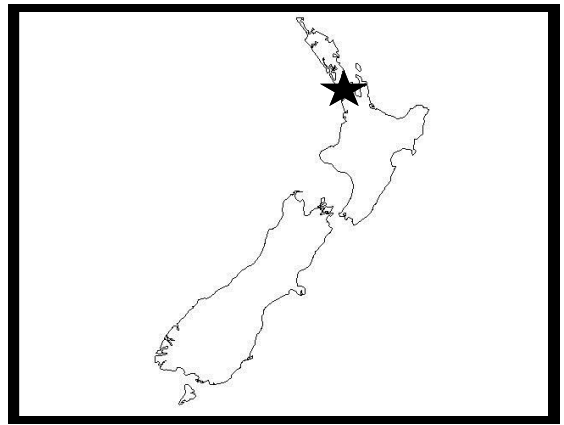

## PROGRAM

Situated on New Zealand's North Island, the University of Auckland offers study abroad students both strong academics and an outstanding location for travel and exploration. The University is New Zealand's only member of *Universitas 21*, an international alliance of comprehensive research-intensive universities. More than 40,000 students make up the current population, including approximately 4,000 international students.

## ACADEMICS

The world-class reputation of the university is reflected in the huge range of subjects available to you. No matter the subject, you will study alongside Kiwi students. The Business School is the only New Zealand business school to be internationally accredited by all three of the world's leading associations. During your stay, you can choose courses from eight different faculties—most notably, Arts, Business, Creative Arts, Engineering and Science. Please note that Kiwi 3-year undergraduate degrees are much more specialized, therefore 200- and 300-level courses require a strong background in the area. Pay careful attention to choose courses offered during your term abroad. Most courses include 2-4 hours of lecture per week. You will also be expected to participate in tutorials, which are small discussion groups led by a teaching assistant. A typical course load is 3-4 classes. Search courses here:

## LOCATION: AUCKLAND, NEW ZEALAND

The Auckland region is home to 1.3 million people, approximately one-third of New Zealand's population. If you are a water lover, then Auckland is your kind of place. The city is known as the "City of Sails" because of the number of yachts that sail in the harbors and the adjoining Hauraki Gulf. Only 20 minutes from the wild beaches and a few hours from the ski slopes, it is a perfect location if you like outdoor activities. Combining the natural beauty of New Zealand with the country's leading cultural scene, Auckland has all the qualities that make New Zealand a popular destination.

## HOUSING & MEALS

You will live in halls of residence or off-campus student flats. The housing is arranged through the housing office and will be a short walk to the campus. You will have a single room shared with other domestic and international students. Within the flats you will share a living space and the kitchen. Meals are not included with the housing.

## CULTURAL CONNECTIONS

As an enrolled student you will be a member of the AUSU (Auckland University Student Union), which allows you to join any of the university's 120 sporting and special interest clubs. Within half an hour of the city are numerous attractions and adventure activities, including museums, botanical gardens, the Blue Canyon, vineyards, horseback riding, and sailing.
