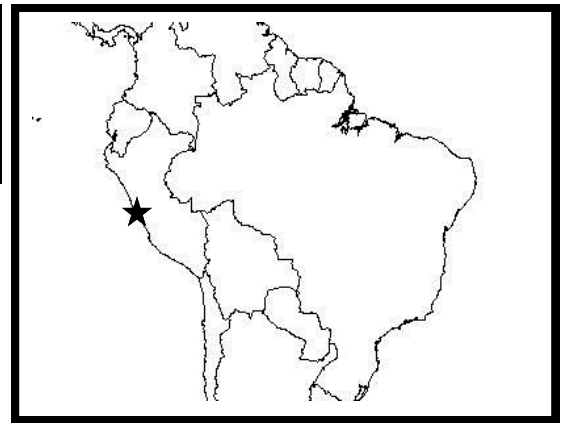

PROGRAM

Gain hands-on experience by participating in community service projects, while studying Spanish language, development, and Latin American and area studies. This program is a good fit for students looking to immerse in the local community and engage in service work while abroad.

ACADEMICS

Depending on your Spanish language level, you will enroll in coursework in Spanish at the Centro Bartolome de Las Casas (CBC) (1-2 years college level Spanish required) or complete your courses in English at the Universidad San Ignacio de Loyola (USIL). You will be in classes with other program participants and will be taught by local professors. All students enroll in a Spanish language class. Course selections are limited but may include: Art & History of Peru, History of Latin American Politics, Biodiversity of Peru, and Special Issues of Development. In addition to weekend service projects, Students at the CBC may have the option to enroll in internship placements during the week.

LOCATION: CUSCO, PERU

Civilization in Peru dates back 10,000 years, and the country is home to world renowned archeological and World Heritage sites such as Machu Picchu as well as natural wonders like the Amazon rainforest, Andes, and coastline. Cusco is the archaeological capital of the Americas and the oldest continuously inhabited city on the continent. Its legacy as the capital of the Incan empire is still easily visible today. Many of the city streets are lined with original stone walls and crowded with Quechua-speaking descendants of the Incas.

HOUSING & MEALS

Homestays are an integral part of the ProWorld experience. Living with a Cusqueñan family provides you the opportunity to practice your Spanish and learn more about the Andean way of life. You will be provided a private room and share three meals a day with your family.

CULTURAL CONNECTIONS

This is a service based program and throughout the semester you will be engaged in cultural excursions and local service projects. Project work may focus on environment, health, social or economic development in Cusco and the surrounding communities.

Student Costs**:

The cost of living varies in other cities and countries. Talk to returnees from the program to find out what personal expenses to expect, but remember that they vary by lifestyle. Check www.xe.com for current exchange rates.
