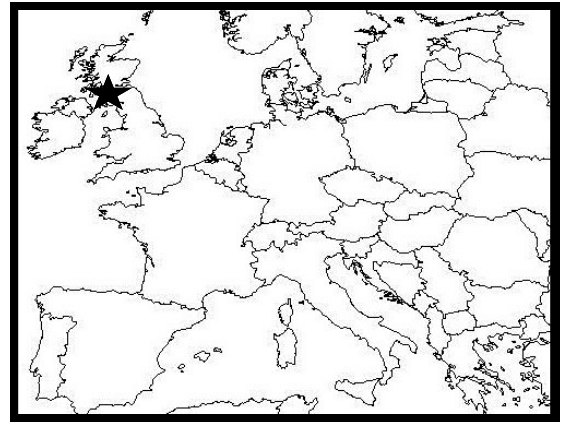

## PROGRAM

Live and study with local Scottish and international students at the historic and prestigious University of Glasgow. Founded in 1451, it's the fourth oldest university in the UK and enrolls more than 21,500 student full-time. The student body has a large international population and draws from more than 120 countries. Yet it is also distinctly Scottish; 73% of the student body is domestic. Glasgow's international office provides on-site support and a week-long orientation.

## ACADEMICS

Glasgow offers over 900 courses with a wide range of topics (e.g., art history, biomedical sciences, business, computer science, engineering, musicology, television studies, Scottish literature). Some constraints exist on which math, engineering, statistics, and philosophy courses can be taken in the fall semester. Unique course offerings include an introductory-level studio art class at the Glasgow School of Art (GSA), a bag piping course at the National Piping Center, an anatomy module with human cadavers designed for pre-med students, and service learning courses (see Cultural Connections). ## LOCATION: GLASGOW, SCOTLAND, UK

The University of Glasgow is located in the West End of Glasgow, the largest city in Scotland. There is a busy shopping district directly next to the campus. The city center is easily accessible on foot or via metro. Glasgow is known for its friendly, fun-loving inhabitants and was recently voted the "politest city in the UK." As one of Britain's urban hubs, it offers a wide variety of galleries, parks, museums, and concerts. National Geographic Travel describes it as an "exuberant, design-conscious city of high sophistication and even higher style."

## HOUSING & MEALS

Housing is in university residence halls and apartments within a 20-30 minute walk of campus. Students typically live in single bedrooms with bathroom and kitchen facilities that are shared with local and international students.

## CULTURAL CONNECTIONS

Two student unions ("The GUU" and "QMU") offer a variety of extracurricular activities, including over 40 societies (e.g., the International Society, Scottish country dance) and a range of intramural sports; for more, see [The GUU](#) and [QMU](#) websites. Glasgow offers unique services learning courses; these include a community organization placement and regular reflective classroom component. It's an especially enriching way to engage with the local community and your local classmates.

# HOW TO APPLY

⇒ **Attend Study Abroad 101**

Held weekdays at the I-House. See website for schedule ([www.du.edu/intl/abroad/info\\_sessions.html](http://www.du.edu/intl/abroad/info_sessions.html)).

⇒ **Attend a Regional Advising Session**

Mandatory if you are considering the UK or Ireland. See website for schedule (same link as above).

⇒ **Meet with an international education advisor.**

⇒ **Apply for a passport—<http://travel.state.gov/passport>**

If you already have one, make sure you know where it is and when it expires.

⇒ **Apply to study abroad!**

- Non-Cherrington students will be charged a \$50 application fee to their DU account.

**Note:** *Cherrington status may be revoked at any time due to a change in your student conduct or academic status. Also, the OIE will request your DU transcript; check and clear any holds now to avoid delays in processing your application!*

## PROGRAM APPLICATION: DUE AFTER YOU'VE BEEN NOMINATED
