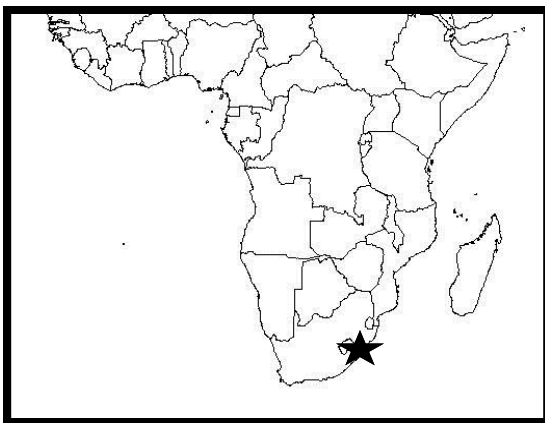

PROGRAM

This program is coordinated by Interstudy, and offers students the opportunity to study at the University of KwaZulu-Natal, Howard College Campus. The University was founded in 1910, and currently enrolls nearly 18,000 students. This is an excellent location for the more independent student who is seeking a diverse campus environment in an urban setting and the opportunity to live on-campus with South African students. The campus is located above the city in an environmental conservancy, and is a ten minute drive from the coast.

ACADEMICS

The University of KwaZulu-Natal offers courses in Engineering, Humanities, and Development and Social Sciences. Limited coursework is available in Management Studies and in Science and Agriculture. Music courses are also available—Durban is considered the center of jazz and ethno-music in South Africa. Music performance classes will require an audition once in Durban. Credit hours vary by course—students will typically take 14-16 semester credits, or 21-24 quarter credits. You are able to bring back up to 27 quarter credits from this semester-long program.

LOCATION: DURBAN, SOUTH AFRICA

Durban (pop. 3.5 million) is South Africa's third largest city and offers a unique blend of Indian, Western, and Zulu cultures. The city is known for its beaches, warm weather, and nightlife. While Durban is a popular tourist destination, it tends to attract South African tourists rather than U.S./Western visitors. Since you will encounter relatively few U.S. students, you have ample opportunities to connect with South African students.

HOUSING & MEALS

You will live in a single room on-campus. Your kitchen, bathroom, and common area will be shared with local students. Meals are not provided.

CULTURAL CONNECTIONS

The University of KwaZulu-Natal hosts a number of student clubs focusing on a wide range of interests such as hiking, music, film, and photography. The Howard College campus offers many athletic activities, including aerobics, basketball, ballroom dancing, canoeing, rugby, surfing, water polo, and many more. Durban's annual International Film Festival is hosted by the University.

While this program does not include formal volunteer opportunities, you may talk to Interstudy or the university's international office about service options in the local community. Volunteering is an excellent way to meet new people, learn more about local cultures, and explore issues facing South Africans.

Note: Cherrington status may be revoked at any time due to a change in your student conduct or academic status. Also, the OIE will request your DU transcript; check and clear any holds now to avoid delays in processing your application!

PROGRAM APPLICATION: DUE AFTER YOU'VE BEEN NOMINATED

Once you've been nominated for this program, you will be required to submit the following:

- Interstudy online application: <http://www.interstudy.org>
DO NOT pay the application fee! Skip this step (7). You will receive an error message after step 9 saying you have to complete step 7 to finish. Ignore this—Interstudy will later go back in to your application and check off the application fee as complete.
- Home Institution Approval Form
- Two Academic Recommendations (use Interstudy forms)
- Six (6) passport-sized photos (2x2). These must be passport/ID—type photos on photo paper. Please print your name on the back of each photo, and place them in a sealed envelope.
- U KwaZulu-Natal application—you will receive this application from Interstudy after submitting your initial online application.
