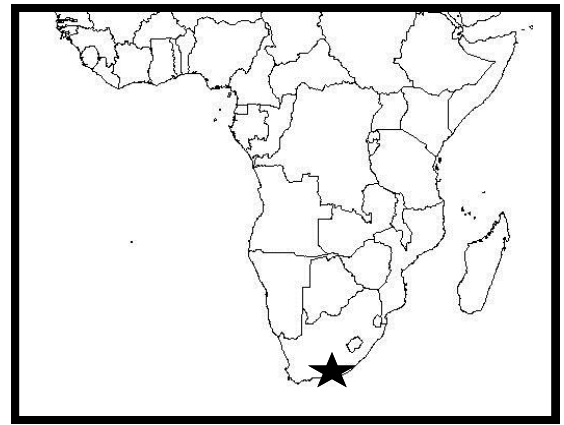

PROGRAM

This program is coordinated by Interstudy, and offers students the opportunity to study at Nelson Mandela Metropolitan University (NMMU). NMMU was founded in 1964, and enrolls nearly 24,000 students. This university is considered one of the most culturally and linguistically diverse in southern Africa. NMMU's mission is to contribute to regional, national, and global sustainability through its educational opportunities. The University prides itself on being an engaged and people-centered institution.

ACADEMICS

Students may select from a wide range of classes within any of NMMU's faculties, which include Arts, Education, Health Sciences, Science, Law, Business and Economic Sciences, or Engineering, the Built Environment, and Information Technology. You may select courses from multiple departments as scheduling allows. Students are encouraged to take CLS100: Community Service Learning. Credit hours vary by course—students will typically take 14-16 semester credits, or 21-24 quarter credits. You are able to bring back up to 27 quarter credits from this semester-long program.

LOCATION: PORT ELIZABETH, SOUTH AFRICA

The NMMU campus is located in the Summerstrand district of Port Elizabeth (pop. 1.5 million) in the Eastern Cape region. Port Elizabeth is known as the "friendly city" and is the country's fifth largest city. The campus is located in a nature reserve, and the city is home to beautiful parks, gardens, and beaches. Several wildlife preserves are located in the region, including the Addo Elephant Park and the Maitland Nature Preserve.

HOUSING & MEALS

You will live off campus in Annie's Cove, NMMU's international student housing complex. You will have a single room and will share a bathroom and kitchenette with other international students. The gated community is a 15-20 minute walk from the campus. Meals are not included.

CULTURAL CONNECTIONS

NMMU offers a wide range of student societies and a large sports center. Since Port Elizabeth is on the coast, water sports such as surfing and windsurfing are popular activities for students. Consider taking NMMU's service learning course and work with the Xolelanani Youth Center. The university provides transportation to service sites. Participating in service learning will provide you with the opportunity to meet new people outside the context of the university and gain firsthand knowledge of issues facing South African communities.

Student Costs**:

- Meals

The cost of living varies in other cities and countries. Talk to returnees from the program to find out what personal expenses to expect, but remember that they vary by lifestyle. Check www.xe.com for current exchange rates.

- Non-Cherrington students will be charged a \$50 application fee to their DU account.

Note: Cherrington status may be revoked at any time due to a change in your student conduct or academic status. Also, the OIE will request your DU transcript; check and clear any holds now to avoid delays in processing your application!

PROGRAM APPLICATION: DUE AFTER YOU'VE BEEN NOMINATED

Once you have been nominated for this program, you will be required to submit the following:

- Interstudy online application: <http://www.interstudy.org>
DO NOT pay the application fee! Skip this step (7). You will receive an error message after step 9 saying you have to complete step 7 to finish. Ignore this—Interstudy will later go back in to your application and check off the application fee as complete.
- Home Institution Approval Form
- Two Academic Recommendations (use Interstudy forms)
- Six (6) passport-sized photos (2x2). These must be passport/ID—type photos on photo paper. Please print your name on the back of each photo, and place them in a sealed envelope.
- NMMU application—you will receive this application from Interstudy after submitting your initial online application.
