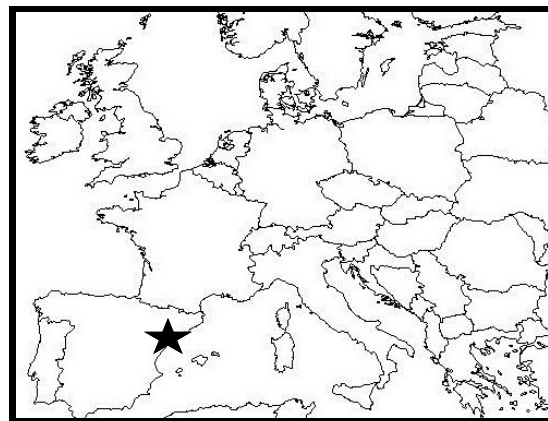

ELIGIBILITY

GPA: 3.0, 1 year college-level Spanish. Enrollment is limited.

PROGRAM

Pompeu Fabra University was established in 1990, and hosts approximately 10,200 students. This program is appropriate for self-reliant students who are seeking the opportunity to be independent. As students will work directly with the university rather than through a separate study abroad organization, this is not an appropriate program for those who prefer extensive support services or who are seeking organized excursions and activities. Strong Spanish language skills are crucial.

ACADEMICS

Students may choose courses from the Hispanic and European Studies program (which includes language study), from regular undergraduate offerings (typically in economics), and from the ESCI School of International Business. Courses at Pompeu Fabra are taught in Catalan, Spanish, or English. Enrollment in courses taught in Spanish will be dependent upon language ability. Apart from the Hispanic and European Studies program, courses in English tend to be concentrated in the Business Administration/Economics faculty and the ESCI School of International Business. UPF offers honors options which include independent research and academic internships; please note that these options may carry additional admission requirements.

LOCATION: BARCELONA, SPAIN

Barcelona (1.6 million) is located in northeastern Spain on the Mediterranean coast, and is the capital of Catalonia. The city is the second largest in Spain, and is well known for its art, architecture, and cultural heritage. The official languages of Barcelona include both Catalan and Spanish. Barcelona is a cosmopolitan business and cultural center, and is home to excellent art museums, restaurants, and beaches.

HOUSING & MEALS

Accommodations are not provided by the program; you are responsible for setting up your housing arrangements. However, Pompeu Fabra University provides references to organizations that supply student housing on its website. Please review the "Services" section on the Pompeu Fabra website for more information regarding potential costs of accommodations and meals.

CULTURAL CONNECTIONS

The self-reliant student who chooses the independence of this program will find many cultural connections in the very European and metropolitan city of Barcelona. Over 10% of UPF students are from other countries; all of the students in the HESP program are foreign students, primarily from the U.S. We encourage students to seek out interactions with local and other international students in their housing, their classes, and extracurricular activities.

HOW TO APPLY

⇒ **Attend Study Abroad 101**

⇒ **Meet with an international education advisor**

⇒ **Apply to study abroad!**

- DU short-answer essays
- Acknowledgement of Program Structure Form (get this from OIE Spain advisor)
- Official transcript(s) from other universities attended, if applicable
- Non-Cherrington students will be charged a \$50 application fee to their DU account.

Note: Cherrington status may be revoked at any time due to a change in your student conduct or academic status. Also, the OIE will request your DU transcript; check and clear any holds now to avoid delays in processing your application!

PROGRAM APPLICATION: DUE AFTER YOU'VE BEEN NOMINATED

Once you have been nominated for this program, you will be required to submit the following:
