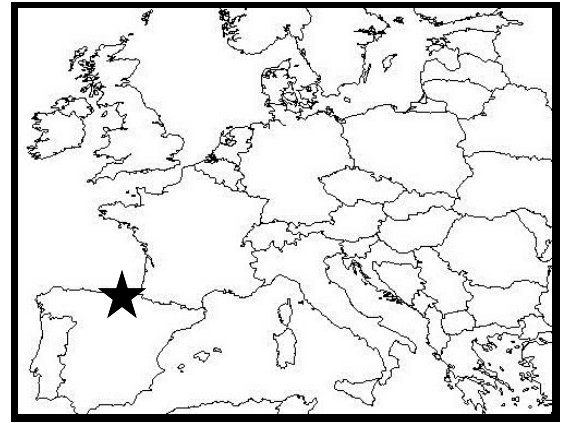

PROGRAM

International Studies Abroad (ISA) offers beginning, intermediate, and advanced level students the opportunity to study Spanish in Bilbao. The University of Deusto has an enrollment of 10,000, 15% of whom are international students. This program also offers internship and service learning options for students at an advanced level of Spanish.

ACADEMICS

Two different programs are offered in Santander. Both programs are available to students of all Spanish levels, and they offer coursework in Spanish and English. Students must first select at least 180 contact hours with other international students, then you may select up to two courses with local students.

- The *Spanish Language and Culture (SLC)* program is for students at all levels, and combines language study and coursework in other areas of study. Please visit the ISA website for a current and complete list of courses.
- The *Spanish Language, International Relations & Economics (SLIRE)* program at the University of Deusto combines Spanish language student with coursework in international relations, business, political science, economics, and law.

Both *internships* and a *service learning* course are also offered for credit to students with a high level of Spanish.

LOCATION: BILBAO, SPAIN

Bilbao (pop. 350,000) is perhaps most well-known in recent years for the Guggenheim museum, and has reinvented itself into both a culturally-rich and hip city in northern Spain. Located in the Basque country, Bilbao is a contemporary city with access to mother nature in all directions. Bilbao is an excellent location for immersion, as there are fewer U.S. students studying abroad here than in many other DU study abroad sites in Spain.

HOUSING & MEALS

Most students choose to live with host families carefully selected by ISA's resident staff. Living with a host family is an excellent way to become immersed in Spanish culture and improve your Spanish language skills. Meals are provided in the home stay setting. *Residencias* are a second housing option; no meals are supplied with this option. You may not select independent housing. Meals on program excursions may be extra.

CULTURAL CONNECTIONS

One of the highlights of this program are the internship and service learning options, which allow advanced-level students to get a unique perspective on business or community in Bilbao. In addition, the program excursions provide ample opportunity to explore Spain's wealth of architecture, cultural heritage, music, and scenery. The on-site staff can help you identify other opportunities to interact with the community and the other students on campus. Your host family will also be a great connection to the Spanish culture.

Student Costs**:

- Meals (if you choose the *residencia*)

The cost of living varies in other cities and countries. Talk to returnees from the program to find out what personal expenses to expect, but remember that they vary by lifestyle. Check www.xe.com for current exchange rates.

HOW TO APPLY

⇒ **Attend Study Abroad 101**

Note: *Cherrington status may be revoked at any time due to a change in your student conduct or academic status. Also, the OIE will request your DU transcript; check and clear any holds now to avoid delays in processing your application!*

PROGRAM APPLICATION: DUE AFTER YOU'VE BEEN NOMINATED

Once you have been nominated for this program, you will be required to submit the following:

- Printed confirmation email from ISA (you receive this after completing your online application)
