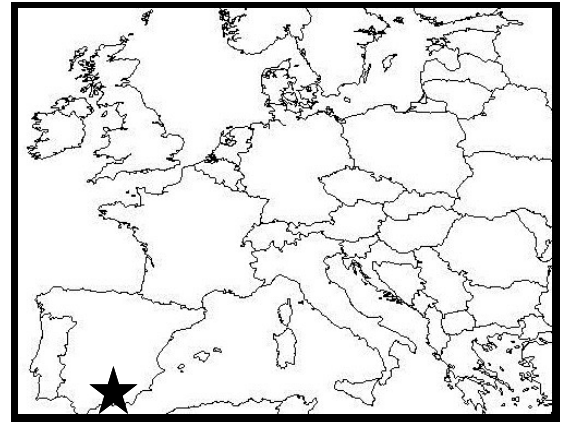

## PROGRAM

International Studies Abroad (ISA) provides the opportunity to study Spanish in Granada. Several excursions are included in your program cost. The University of Granada has 70,000 students; the Center for Modern Languages, where you will study, has 7,500 students. The program includes a thorough orientation and very supportive on-site staff.

## ACADEMICS

Three different programs are offered in Granada. All classes are with international students.

- The *Intensive Spanish Language (ISL)* program is entirely focused on language acquisition; courses are available at all levels of Spanish.
- The *Spanish Language, Culture and Electives in English (SLCE)* program combines language courses with classes such as Spanish culture, history, and politics.
- The *Hispanic Studies (HS)* program is for advanced level students (8+ quarters) focusing on subject areas such as literature, culture, art, history, politics, and geography.

Internships are available to students with a high level of Spanish.

## LOCATION: GRANADA, SPAIN

Granada (250,000) is located in southern Spain. The city is probably best known as the home to the Alhambra, a massive Arab fortress and complex of palaces. The province of Granada contains both the Sierra Nevada mountain range and the beaches of the Costa Tropical.

## HOUSING & MEALS

Most students choose to live with host families carefully selected by ISA's resident staff. Living with a host family is an excellent way to become immersed in Spanish culture and improve your Spanish language skills. Meals are provided in the home stay setting. Other housing options include *residencias* (meals included except Sundays) or apartments (no meals included). You may not select independent housing. Meals on program excursions may be extra.

## CULTURAL CONNECTIONS

The program excursions provide ample opportunity to explore Spain's wealth of architecture, culture heritage, music, and scenery. In addition, the on-site resident staff can help you identify other opportunities to interact with the local community, such as *intercambios* (conversation partners), flamenco dance lessons, and other extracurricular activities. Your host family will also be a great connection to the local culture.

# HOW TO APPLY

⇒ **Attend Study Abroad 101**

Held weekdays at the I-House. See website for schedule ([www.du.edu/intl/abroad/info\\_sessions.html](http://www.du.edu/intl/abroad/info_sessions.html)).

⇒ **Attend a Regional Advising Session**

Mandatory if you are considering Spain. See website for schedule (same link as above).

⇒ **Meet with an international education advisor.**

Learn about your options and get answers to your questions.

⇒ **Apply for a passport—<http://travel.state.gov/passport>**

If you already have one, make sure you know where it is and when it expires.

⇒ **Apply to study abroad!**

- DU short-answer essays
- Official transcript(s) from other universities attended, if applicable
- Non-Cherrington students will be charged a \$50 application fee to their DU account.

**Note:** *Cherrington status may be revoked at any time due to a change in your student conduct or academic status. Also, the OIE will request your DU transcript; check and clear any holds now to avoid delays in processing your application!*

## PROGRAM APPLICATION: DUE AFTER YOU'VE BEEN NOMINATED

Once you have been nominated for this program, you will be required to submit the following:

- Printed confirmation email from ISA (you receive this after completing your online application)
