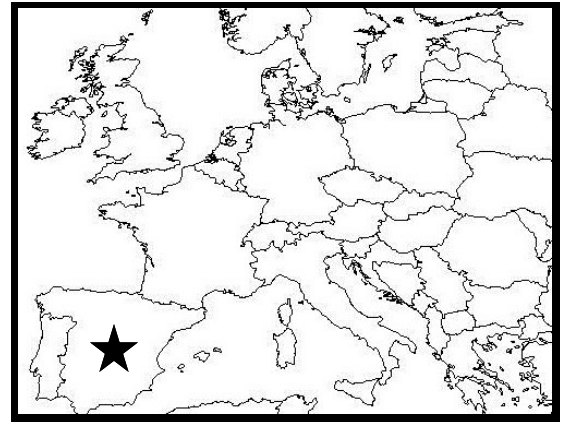

PROGRAM

International Studies Abroad (ISA) offers beginning, intermediate, and advanced level students the opportunity to study Spanish in Madrid. Antonio de Nebrija is a small private university with approximately 3,500 students. The Complutense University of Madrid is Spain's largest university with approximately 100,000 students.

ACADEMICS

Three different programs are offered in Madrid. Only classes in the SS program are integrated with Spanish students.

- The **Liberal Arts (LA)** program at Antonio de Nebrija University offers courses in Spanish language for all levels as well as additional courses in Spanish or English.
- The **Studies with Spaniards (SS)** program at Antonio de Nebrija provides the opportunity for superior level students (9+ quarters) to take regular university courses with Spanish students in a variety of fields.
- The **Spanish Language and Culture (SLC)** program at the Complutense University focuses on language acquisition; courses are available at all levels of Spanish, with a few electives in English.

LOCATION: MADRID, SPAIN

Madrid (3.3 million) is Spain's capital city and is centrally located. World renowned art museums such as the Museo del Prado and Reina Sofia, plazas, palaces, parks, and dynamic nightlife characterize this modern yet traditional city.

HOUSING & MEALS

Most students choose to live with host families carefully selected by ISA's resident staff. Living with a host family is an excellent way to become immersed in Spanish culture and improve your Spanish language skills. Meals are provided in the home stay setting. Other housing options include *residencias* or apartments; no meals are provided with either option. You may not select independent housing. Meals on program excursions may be extra.

CULTURAL CONNECTIONS

The program excursions provide ample opportunity to explore Spain's wealth of architecture, culture heritage, music, and scenery. In addition, the on-site resident staff can help you identify other opportunities to interact with the local community, such as *intercambios* (conversation partners) and other extracurricular activities. Your host family will also be a great connection to the local culture.

COST

Billed by DU:

Non-Cherrington Scholars will be charged a \$50 application fee.

Student Costs:**

HOW TO APPLY

⇒ **Attend Study Abroad 101**

Note: *Cherrington status may be revoked at any time due to a change in your student conduct or academic status. Also, the OIE will request your DU transcript; check and clear any holds now to avoid delays in processing your application!*

PROGRAM APPLICATION: DUE AFTER YOU'VE BEEN NOMINATED
